### Canada Summer Jobs Initiative

The **New Canada Summer Jobs Initiative** provides wage subsidies to enable not-for-profit, public and small, private sector employers with 50 or fewer employees to create career-related summer jobs for students between the ages of 15 and 30 at the start of employment. It helps students who need it the most, including Aboriginal youth, visible minorities, youth with disabilities, and those living in communities with high youth unemployment rates; small urban, rural, or remote areas; and/or high crime areas.

The **New Canada Summer Jobs Initiative** helps employers create jobs that will meet their needs while benefiting the young people most in need of employment assistance. Eligibility criteria can be found at [servicecanada.gc.ca](http://servicecanada.gc.ca). Postmark deadline for employers to submit their application is March 30, 2007.
