LEGAL REFERENCE:

Section 6(a) of the Students Financial Assistance Act

POLICY:

Historically, post-secondary students who wanted to attend courses by correspondence have been denied funding because they were not studying <u>at</u> an approved institution. Modern technology allows broader access to post secondary education and presents more opportunities for students to study in a home environment.

GUIDELINES:

Post-secondary students enrolled in distance education, correspondence, on-line programs or other programs of study with non-traditional forms of delivery will be considered for funding under the *Act*.

Students are not restricted to studying in their home Yukon community; however, as outlined in the *Act*, students must be enrolled in a designated institution as a full-time student in order to be eligible.

If eligible according to policy YG3A – Airfare/travel allowance policy, students will also receive an allowance for travel.
