- 4. Cheques post-dated to January 31<sup>st</sup> will be accepted. You may submit one cheque to cover multiple applications. Cheques/money orders should be made payable to the Minister of Finance. A service charge of \$20.00 will be levied for all dishonored cheques.
- 5. Prior to a permit being issued, all permit holders (and helpers) must obtain a Fisher Registration Card (FRC -issued annually by Fisheries and Oceans Canada). To avoid delays in issuing your permit, it is recommended that you submit a copy of your **2008 FRC** with this application. For your convenience and at your request only, Fisheries and Oceans Canada will fax a copy to our office when your card is issued.
- 6. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that the MAL Licensing Unit is advised of any changes to your contact information.
- 7. Harvest logs and royalty fees must be submitted to the Ministry of Agriculture and Lands within 10 days of the permit expiration. The form must be submitted even if no harvesting takes place. Failure to do so constitutes a violation of Section 9(3) and (4) of the Fisheries Act Regulations (RSBC) and those permit holders will be turned over to enforcement staff. If harvest logs and/or royalties are not received within the timeframe specified, the permit holder will be ineligible for permits.
