***IMPORTANT**

- A. The transfer of a water right does not take effect until approved by the Regional Water Manager. Therefore, if you wish to dispose of any, or all of the land to which the licence is appurtenant, you should notify the regional Water Stewardship Division office.
- B. If there are any charges (mortgages, etc.) against the property described in the licensee's land (Transferor's land), this application cannot be accepted unless signed by the holder of any such charge.
- C. A detailed scale drawing which shows the location of any new works must be submitted with the application.
- D. If any proposed new works cross private property, notice must be served on every property owner affected. The matter of entry onto privately owned land for the construction and maintenance of works is one for arrangement between the parties concerned. If joint use and maintenance of works is involved, this is a matter for arrangement between the parties concerned.

If the proposed new works cross a public road, you must notify your local road foreperson or the Ministry of Transportation District Engineer.

If your proposed intake is located in a stream which supports fish life, adequate screening of the intake must be provided in accordance with any requirements of authorities having jurisdiction over fisheries in the area.

- E. The fee for transfer of appurtenancy of a licence is identified in **Schedule 1 – Water Application Fees** (effective June 1, 2003), payable by each recipient of transferred rights, upon issue of licence.
