Chief Electoral Officer Announces Results of the Referendum on Electoral Reform

Victoria – Chief Electoral Officer Harry Neufeld announced today the final results of the Referendum on Electoral Reform. Elections BC administered the referendum in conjunction with the May 17th, 2005 provincial general election in accordance with the *Electoral Reform Referendum Act* and the *Referendum Act*.

Two thresholds were set by the *Electoral Reform Referendum Act* in order for the referendum results to be binding on government:

- (a) at least 60% of the valid votes cast in support of the question stated on the referendum ballot, and
- (b) in at least 48 of the 79 electoral districts, more than 50% of the valid votes cast in support of that question.

Based on the final results, only one of the two thresholds was met.

Voters voted 'yes' by more than 50% in 77 of 79 electoral districts. Of the total valid votes cast, 57.69% voted 'yes' on the referendum question. Under the *Electoral Reform Referendum Act*, the Chief Electoral Officer is required to announce the referendum results, rather than the Attorney General as required by the *Referendum Act*.

Elections BC is a non-partisan Office of the Legislature responsible for the impartial administration of provincial elections and referendums, voter registration and voter education.
