BC BOOK PRIZES AND BC BOOK PRIZES ON TOUR

Each year, the BC Book Prizes celebrate the achievements of B.C. writers and publishers. In 2008, BC150 Years will sponsor the Haig-Brown Regional Prize, awarded to the author of the book that contributes most to the enjoyment and understanding of British Columbia, as well as a special 25-community author tour that will bring some of B.C.'s most prized writers to libraries and




schools across the province.

BC Spirit Squares

The \$20-million BC Spirit Squares program supports the creation of public celebration spaces that reflect each community's unique character, heritage and cultural diversity, providing a permanent public space for celebrating BC150 Years as well as cultural festivals, open-air concerts and other future public events.

In 2008, over 9,000 Indigenous people from across North America will participate in the North American Indigenous Games, an international competition featuring 16 sports and more than 60 hours of cultural performances.



BC150 Years is helping to celebrate the Games by sponsoring a very special provincewide event. Beginning in May 2008, a six-metre red cedar log will be transformed into a Spirit Pole that commemorates the rich history of B.C.'s Aboriginal peoples. Created under the guidance of a Master Carver, the cedar pole will travel to over 40 communities. Young and old will be invited to try their hand using traditional carving methods to coax the spirit and First Nations legend out of the cedar pole.

WALK FOR RECONCILIATION

The Walk for Reconciliation unites Aboriginal people and other British Columbians in a spectacular show of solidarity, acceptance and mutual respect. Featuring a symbolic walk with thousands of participants, this program celebrates Aboriginal cultures and their important place in B.C.'s heritage.


A week of events, programs and activities showcasing B.C. pride, co-ordinated by 2010 Legacies Now and the Spirit of BC Community Committees.
