This is care provided to clients to enable them to regain or sustain a maximum level of functioning. One of these beds is designated for palliative care A twenty-four hour emergency service program is also offered. The hospital provides inpatient and outpatient physiotherapy, occupational therapy, x-ray and lab services. Also housed is the primary care demonstration project, assistance given from a gualified nurse

practitioner and physician. Many community outreach programs are operated throughout the year from the Day Hospital, i.e. arthritis self management, foot clinics, etc. An active outpatient department that provides specialty clinics and booked appointments. A Palliative Care Program is also operated out of this facility. The third floor of the hospital houses the Cobequid Drug Dependency Program. This is a regional drug and alcohol rehabilitation program which can be accessed by calling 597-8647
