## Student jobs

Placement étudiant du Québec meets the student manpower needs of the Québec public service, private companies and municipalities. It operates like any other job placement and employee recruitment service.

The Placement étudiant du Québec Web site provides access to the **Online Placement** service, which allows you to list your candidacies and look for job offers.

## Online Placement

By listing your student candidacies, i.e. summaries of your résumé, you are offering your services to thousands of employers in the private sector. Simultaneously, you are registering with the bank of candidacies for Québec government summer jobs, which are not listed by the Online Placement service. To obtain summer employment with the public service, you must list your student candidacies and ensure they continue to be active.

Once they have been listed, your candidacies will be available for consultation by all other employers. Thanks to Online Placement, you can also seek job offers and quickly consult those that correspond to your profile. To take advantage of every job offer, consult Online Placement regularly. If you register for "Job Alerts!", you will receive an email, on a daily or weekly basis, notifying you of new offers that correspond to your criteria. From Online Placement, you can access information on a specific trade or profession by clicking the LMI Online hyperlink.
