You should also understand how to complete the following paper forms during your field activities:

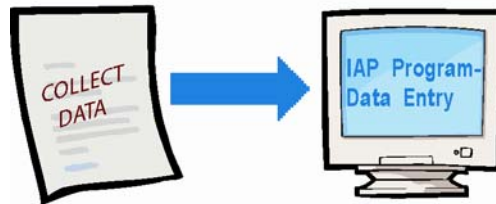
