Pursuant to section 10 of the *Summary Proceedings Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. S-9, Council made the following regulations:

- **1.** For the purposes of section 10 of the Act, the form of the ticket shall Form of ticket be as set out in Schedule 1 to these regulations.
- **2.** For the purposes of section 10 of the Act the offences under the Designated offences provisions of the enactments set out in Schedule 2 to these regulations are designated as offences in respect of which a ticket may be issued.

Words and expressions describing offence

3. (1) The words or expressions set out in column 1 of Schedule 2 may be used on a ticket to designate an offence under the provision of the enactment referred to in column 2 thereof.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), any words or expressions used on a ticket which describe with sufficient clarity the offence committed shall be for all purposes a sufficient description of an offence designated in Schedule 2.

Penalty for out of court settlement

Where there appears in respect of an offence described in column 1 of Schedule 2, under a provision of an enactment referred to in Column 2 thereof, an amount in Column 3 thereof setting out a specified penalty for out-of-court settlement in respect of that offence, the issuing officer may enter on the ticket the specified penalty and the total of the specified penalty and the surcharge prescribed under subsection 9(2) of the *Victims of Crime Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. V-3.1, and where such an endorsement is made the provision of section 11 of the *Summary Proceedings Act* have effect.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT PETROLEUM STORAGE TANKS REGULATIONS

(Approved by His Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council dated 5 June 2001.)

Pursuant to section 25 of the *Environmental Protection Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. E-9, Council made the following regulations:

INTERPRETATION

1. (1) In these regulations Definitions (a) "aboveground" means a storage tank which is installed with 90% aboveground or more of its volume above the ground surface or above the lowest level of a building, and includes tanks installed in a basement or cellar; (b) "alteration" includes repair, replacement, upgrading or removal alteration of any part of an underground storage tank system, or any part of an aboveground tank system required to be registered pursuant to these regulations. (c) "bulk petroleum sales outlet" means a place where petroleum is bulk petroleum sales outlet stored in storage facilities at a fixed location by a wholesaler for delivery to retail outlets or for direct delivery to users; (d) "cathodic protection" or "cathodically protected" means a cathodic protection method of preventing or reducing corrosion to a metal surface by making the metal a cathode by means of either an impressed direct current or attaching sacrificial anodes; (e) "Class 1 liquid" means a petroleum liquid which has a flash point Class 1 liquid below 30 degrees C; (f) "corrosion specialist" means corrosion specialist (i) a person recognized by the National Association of Corrosion Engineers as a corrosion technician, or (ii) a person who has successfully completed training programs and examinations designated by the Minister; (g) "dispenser" means any stationary device which is used to deliver dispenser or pump petroleum from a storage tank system; (h) "identification label" means a notice in Form 3A; identification label (i) "identification tag" means a notice in Form 3; identification tag (j) "inspector" means an inspector who has received a Home Heat inspector Inspection (HHIp) license; (k) "large capacity storage tank" means an aboveground storage tank large capacity storage tank of a capacity greater than 2200 litres;

- (1) "leak" means any loss of petroleum products because of a defect leak in or damage to a storage tank system;
- (m) "licensee" means a person who

- (i) inspects, installs or alters a small capacity storage tank and has received a Home Heat Installation (HHI) or Home Heat Inspector (HHIp) license under these regulations,
- (ii) removes an underground storage tank system and has received a Level I license under these regulations,
- (iii) installs or alters an underground storage tank system and has received a Level II license under these regulations;
- (n) "manufacturer's label" means a label by which a storage tank manufacturer's manufacturer indicates compliance with appropriate tank fabrication label standards;

(o) "National Fire Code of Canada" means the National Fire Code of National Fire Code Canada, 1995;

- (p) "nominal capacity" means the capacity established by the nominal capacity manufacturer for a storage tank;
- (q) "operator" means the person responsible for the day to day operator maintenance or operation of a storage tank system and includes the owner, lessee or manager;
- (r) "out of service" means not dispensing petroleum product or not out of service capable of dispensing petroleum product;
- (s) "owner" means the person who has possessory rights to or care, owner control or management of a storage tank system;
- (t) "permanently affix" means to rivet or attach to a storage tank permanently affix system or by some other method approved in writing by the Minister;
- (u) "petroleum" means a mixture of hydrocarbons, with or without petroleum additives, that is used or could be used as a combustible fuel for

(i) internal combustion engines, including gasoline, diesel fuel, and airplane fuel,

- (ii) heating fuel, and
- (iii) lubricant, including used engine oil;
- (v) "precast concrete containment vault" means a liquid-tight steel- precast concrete reinforced precast concrete structure which is manufactured containment vault according to the American Society of Testing Materials (ASTM) standard C-858-83 with the exception that the minimum compressive strength (ASTM section 7.6) for the design shall be 4500 psi at 28 days of age;

- (w) "product piping" means piping which is installed to convey product piping liquid petroleum product from a storage tank to a point of use;
- (x) "reconcile" means to identify unaccounted for differences reconcile between storage tank dip measurements, dispenser meter readings

and, in the case of tanks connected to a heating appliance, fuel consumption records; (y) "retail outlet" means a place where petroleum is stored at a fixed retail outlet location for delivery direct to users; (z) "small capacity storage tank" means an aboveground storage small capacity storage tank tank with a capacity of 2200 litres or less, used as a fuel storage tank for heating residential, commercial or other premises; (aa) "storage tank" or "tank" means any structure, any part of which storage tank or tank is used, or is designed to be used for the underground or aboveground storage of any liquid petroleum of any kind; (bb) "storage tank system" means one or more storage tanks together storage tank system with all connecting piping, both aboveground and underground, including pumps and product transfer apparatus, dyking, and associated spill containment and collection apparatus to a tank above the ground surface and any tank under the ground surface; (cc) "underground" means having 10% volume or more beneath the underground ground surface; (dd) "vent piping" means pipe which is installed to vent petroleum vent piping vapours from a storage tank to the atmosphere;

2. (1) No person shall own, use, construct, alter or operate, or cause to be constructed, altered or operated, an underground storage tank system without a certificate of registration issued under these regulations, for all tanks used in the system.

(2) No person shall own, use, construct, alter or operate or cause to be constructed, altered or operated an aboveground storage tank system in which any portion of any tank is, or is to be in contact with the ground surface without a certificate of registration, issued under these regulations, for all tanks used in the storage tank system that are large capacity storage tanks.

(3) No person shall own, use, construct, alter or operate, or cause to be constructed, altered or operated, an aboveground storage tank system, for the purpose of storing any petroleum product offered for sale at a retail outlet, without a certificate of registration, issued under these regulations, for all tanks used in the system.

(4) The owner of any unregistered storage tank system shall apply on Application, Form 1 for registration of all tanks used in the system within six months of the effective date of these regulations.

- (c) where there is reason to believe that the identification label affixed to the vent pipe has not been issued by the Minister.
- (2) Subsection (1) comes into effect on September 1, 2007.

Effective date

4. (1) A petroleum delivery person who identifies identification label Report to Minister deficiencies pursuant to subsection 3(1) shall forthwith report the deficiencies to the owner of the small capacity storage tank and to the Minister.

(2) Where, in the opinion of the Minister, a storage tank system is not Revoke registration in compliance with the Act or these regulations, the Minister may

- (a) revoke the certificate of registration; and
- (b) remove any identification label or tag.
- (3) A revocation made pursuant to subsection (2) shall become Notice effective upon written notice to the owner.
- (4) Where a change in the name of the owner or operator of a storage Change of owner or tank system is expected, the owner of the system shall notify the Minister operator in writing not less than 30 days before the effective date of the change, giving the name and mailing address of the new owner or operator.

NEW INSTALLATIONS

5. (1) This section applies to storage tank systems which will have

(a) underground tanks installed after these regulations come into force and having a nominal capacity of less than 9000 litres, except those at retail outlets and bulk petroleum sales outlets; and

(b) aboveground tanks installed after these regulations come into force and having a nominal capacity greater than 2200 litres and less

Application of section

than 9000 litres, except tanks at retail outlets and bulk petroleum sales outlets.

Conditional approval

- (2) No person shall construct a storage tank system to which this section applies, unless the person
 - (a) applies to the Minister at least four weeks in advance of the proposed installation; and
 - (b) receives conditional approval of the system from the Minister.

Application, Form 1

(3) An application pursuant to subsection (2) shall be in Form 1.

Response

- (4) The Minister shall, within two weeks of receipt of an application pursuant to subsection (2), indicate in writing to the applicant
 - (a) conditional approval of the storage tank system, subject to compliance with the minimum installation standards prescribed in these regulations and such other conditions as the Minister considers necessary; or
 - (b) refusal of the storage tank system because of the sensitivity of the proposed site, or for any other reason which, in the opinion of the Minister, warrants refusal in order to protect the environment.

Conditional approval

(5) Subject to subsection (6), conditional approval granted pursuant to subsection (4) is valid for twelve months from the date of issue.

Revocation

(6) Where, in the opinion of the Minister, a storage tank system is not in compliance with the Act or these regulations, the Minister may revoke the conditional approval of the storage tank system.

Notice

(7) A revocation made pursuant to subsection (6) is effective upon written notice to the owner or operator of the storage tank system.

Notice by licensee

- (8) A licensee shall give written notice to the Minister
 - (a) at least two days prior to backfilling a newly installed underground storage tank system; and
 - (b) of the completion of an aboveground storage tank system.

Inspection

- (9) Upon receipt of notice pursuant to subsection (8), the Minister may
 (a) have the storage tank system inspected by an environment
 - (a) have the storage tank system inspected by an environment officer;
 - (b) after an inspection has been carried out pursuant to clause (a), issue final approval of the system; and
 - (c) where the Minister is satisfied that the storage tank system complies with these regulations, issue a certificate of registration for the storage tank system.

Ballast

(10) No person shall dispense, or cause to be dispensed, petroleum into an underground storage tank for ballasting purposes except where written permission has been given by the Minister.

Application of section

- **6.** (1) This section applies to
 - (a) all storage tank systems at retail outlets and bulk petroleum sales outlets; and

- (b) all storage tank systems, including those connected to heating appliances, which have a nominal capacity of 9000 litres or greater.
- (2) No person shall construct a storage tank system to which this Conditional section applies unless the person

approval

- (a) applies to the Minister at least four months in advance of the proposed installation; and
- (b) receives conditional approval of the system from the Minister.
- (3) An application pursuant to subsection (2) shall be in Form 1.

Application, Form 1

- (4) The Minister shall, within one month of receipt of an application Response pursuant to subsection (2), indicate in writing to the applicant
 - (a) conditional approval of the system, subject to compliance with the minimum installation standards prescribed in these regulations, and to such conditions as the Minister considers necessary; or
 - (b) refusal of the system because of the sensitivity of the proposed site, or for any other reason which, in the opinion of the Minister warrants refusal in order to protect the environment.
- (5) An applicant who receives conditional approval shall submit Engineering plans engineering plans for the system to the Minister at least four weeks prior to the proposed installation date.

(6) Subject to subsection (7), a conditional approval granted pursuant Conditional to subsection (4) is valid for twelve months from the date of issue.

approval

- (7) Where, in the opinion of the Minister, a storage tank system is not Revocation of in compliance with the Act or these regulations, the Minister may revoke the conditional approval of the system.
- (8) A revocation made pursuant to subsection (7) is effective upon Notice of written notice to the owner or operator of the storage tank system.

revocation

Notice by licensee

conditional

- (9) A licensee shall give written notice to the Minister
 - (a) at least two days prior to covering a newly installed underground storage tank system; and
 - (b) of the completion of an aboveground storage tank system.
- (10) Upon receipt of notice pursuant to subsection (9), the Minister Inspection may have the storage tank system inspected by an environment officer, and may issue

- (a) final approval of the storage tank system; and
- (b) a certificate of registration, in Form 2, for the storage tank system.

MINIMUM CONSTRUCTION AND INSTALLATION STANDARDS

Underground Storage Tank Systems

7. (1) Subject to this section, no person shall install, underground, a steel Underground steel storage tank unless it bears a metal nameplate that complies with

tanks

- (a) section 5 of the National Standard of Canada CAN 4-S603-M85 "Standards for Steel Underground Tanks for Flammable and Combustible Liquids", June 1985; or
- (b) section 5 of the National Standard of Canada CAN 4-S603.1-M85 "Galvanic Corrosion Protection Systems for Steel Underground Tanks for Flammable and Combustible Liquids".

Manner of installation

- (2) A storage tank to which clause (1)(a) is applicable, shall
 - (a) have impressed current cathodic protection; or
 - (b) subject to subsection (3), the storage tank shall be inside a precast concrete containment vault approved by the Minister and installed in compliance with the ASTM standard C-891-83 and the manufacturer's specifications.

Concrete containment vaults

- (3) A storage tank to which clause (2)(b) is applicable shall be installed in a concrete containment vault
 - (a) which has a minimum of 30 cm. clearance between the tank and the sidewalls of the vault;
 - (b) which allows the tank to be accessible for inspection purposes by an opening or manway approved by the Minister;
 - (c) which has a neoprene pad installed between the tank and vault crib or cradle; and
 - (d) which allows the tank to be accessible for measurement of petroleum levels for inventory control purposes.

Galvanically protected tanks

- (4) A storage tank to which clause (1)(b) is applicable
 - (a) shall be installed in compliance with,
 - (i) Appendix B of CAN 4-S603.1-M85 as above,
 - (ii) section 4.3 of the National Fire Code of Canada, and
 - (iii) the manufacturer's specifications; and
 - (b) where the tank has a nominal capacity of 4000 litres or greater, the installation shall include a permanent high impedance meter and zinc reference galvanic monitoring system in compliance with Underwriter Laboratories of Canada (ULC) S603.1-1977, Appendix A.

Fibreglass tanks underground

- (5) A fibreglass storage tank installed underground
 - (a) shall bear a metal label that complies with section 7 of the National Standard of Canada CAN 4-S615-M83 "Reinforced Plastic Underground Tanks for Petroleum Products"; and
 - (b) shall meet the manufacturer's specifications.

Large Capacity Storage Tanks

Field-erected large capacity tanks

8. (1) No person shall construct a field-erected aboveground large capacity storage tank system unless it is designed and built in compliance with API 650-Welded Steel Tanks for Oil Storage.

Shop fabricated, aboveground

- (2) No person shall install aboveground a shop-fabricated
 - (a) horizontal storage tank unless it bears a metal label in compliance with section 4 of the National Standard of Canada CAN

- 4-S601-M84, "Standards for Shop Fabricated Steel Aboveground Horizontal Tanks for Flammable and Combustible Liquids";
- (b) vertical tank unless it bears a metal label in compliance with section 4 of the National Standard of Canada CAN 4-S630-M84, "Standard for Shop Fabricated Steel Aboveground Vertical Tanks for Flammable and Combustible Liquids";
- (c) double wall steel tank unless it bears a metal label in compliance with the National Standard of Canada CAN 4-S603-M84; or
- (d) underground storage tank unless it is approved in writing by the Minister for aboveground use pursuant to clause 35(2)(a).
- (3) No person shall install aboveground a field-erected storage tank or Fire standards a shop-fabricated horizontal or vertical tank except in compliance with the National Fire Code of Canada.

(4) No person shall install aboveground a shop-fabricated horizontal or Construction vertical storage tank at a retail outlet except in compliance with the Department's "Construction Standards for Installation of Aboveground Petroleum Storage System at Retail Outlets".

(5) Every owner of a large capacity storage tank, in contact with the Tank markings ground, shall ensure that the tank is marked in lettering four inches high and on at least two sides of the tank, which identifies the contents of the tank.

(6) No person shall install aboveground a storage tank system unless it Fire standards complies with the National Fire Code of Canada.

(7) No person shall install aboveground a storage tank in a precast Vault, water concrete containment vault, unless the vault is equipped with a secure draining means of draining collected water from the vault.

(8) No person shall install aboveground a large capacity storage tank Prohibition which will be in contact with the ground, unless an adequate corrosion control system is installed at the same time to protect the portion of the tank that may be in contact with the ground.

Small Capacity Storage Tanks

- 9. No person shall install a small capacity storage tank unless
 - (a) it bears a manufacturer's label; and
 - (b) the installation complies with
 - (i) the Department's "Construction Standards for Installation of Aboveground Home Heat Storage System", and
 - (ii) the manufacturer's specifications.

Piping and Associated Fittings

10. (1) No person shall install underground piping and associated Compatibility fittings of a type that is not compatible with the contents of a storage tank.

Aboveground small capacity tank

Standards

(2) No person shall install steel underground piping and associated fittings except a type specified in section B.3.9.1 of the National Standard of Canada CAN 4-S603.1-M85, "Galvanic Corrosion Protection Systems for Steel Underground Tanks for Flammable and Combustible Liquids".

Cathodic protection

- (3) No person shall install underground steel piping and associated fittings
 - (a) without providing cathodic protection for the piping and fittings in compliance with section B.3.10.1 of the National Standard of Canada CAN 4-S603.1-M85; and
 - (b) except in compliance with section B.3.9.3, section B.3.9.4, section B.3.9.5, section B.3.9.7, and section B.3.9.9 of the National Standard of Canada CAN 4-S603.1-M85.

Plastic piping

- (4) No person shall install fibreglass reinforced plastic (FRP) underground piping except
 - (a) in conformity with ULC-C107C-M1984 (Guide for Glass Fibre Reinforced Plastic Pipe and Fittings for Flammable Liquids); and
 - (b) in compliance with the standard required by clause (a) and the manufacturer's specifications.

Vent piping

(5) No person shall install aboveground product piping or vent piping and associated fittings except a steel type specified in section 4.4.2, section 4.4.3, and section 4.4.5 of the National Fire Code of Canada.

Fire standards

(6) No person shall install aboveground product or vent piping and associated fittings except in compliance with section 4.3.5, and section 4.3.10 of the National Fire Code of Canada.

Rigid piping

(7) No person shall install aboveground rigid product piping for Class 1 liquid or diesel oil systems unless the systems begin and end with a swing joint or flexible connector.

Connection standards

- 11. No person shall make a connection to a small capacity storage tank unless it complies with
 - (a) the Department's "Construction Standards for Installation of Aboveground Home Heat Storage System"; and
 - (b) the manufacturer's specifications.

STORAGE TANK CONTRACTORS

Install, alter, remove

12. (1) No person shall install, alter, or remove a small capacity storage tank unless the person is the holder of a valid HHI license.

Effective date

(2) Subsection (1) comes into effect on September 1, 2002.

Underground storage tanks (3) No person shall remove an underground storage tank, unless the person is the holder of a valid Level I license.

Underground storage tank systems (4) No person shall install or alter an underground storage tank system, unless the person is the holder of a valid Level II license.

(5) No person shall install a large capacity storage tank system for the Retail outlet purpose of storage of any petroleum product offered for sale at a retail systems outlet, unless the person is the holder of a valid Level II license.

(6) An applicant for a HHI license or a Level I license shall

Application, HHI or Level I license

- (a) complete and submit Form 4 to the Minister;
- (b) successfully complete any training and examination programs designated by the Minister;
- (c) if the applicant is a Level 1 licensee, pay an annual license fee of \$50; and
- (d) if the applicant is an HHI licensee, pay an annual renewal license fee of
 - (i) \$20 if the licensee has installed fewer than 11 tanks in the previous year, or
 - (ii) \$50 if the licensee has installed 11 tanks or more in the previous year.
- (7) An applicant for a Level II license shall

Application, Level II license

- (a) complete and submit Form 4 to the Minister;
- (b) successfully complete any training and examination programs designated by the Minister;
- (c) submit a certificate of insurance coverage, during the period of the license, for the installer's liability for bodily injury and property damage, including damages arising from a contaminant being introduced into the environment in a sudden, unintended or unexpected occurrence, during the period of insurance, with not less than \$1,000,000 coverage per occurrence;
- (d) submit proof that the insurance required by clause (c) contains a statement that the insurance coverage may not be cancelled except upon thirty days prior written notice to the Minister; and
- (e) pay a license fee of \$100.
- (8) The Minister, if satisfied that an applicant has complied with these License issued regulations, may issue an HHI license, Level I license or Level II license, in Form 5 or Form 6 as applicable.

(9) A license issued under subsection (8)

Expiry

- (a) shall expire on January 31 of the year following the date of issue of the license; and
- (b) may be subject to any conditions that the Minister considers necessary for the protection of the environment.
- 13. (1) Where, in the opinion of the Minister, a licensee has contravened Revocation the Act or these regulations, or where the insurance required by subsection 12(7) has ceased to be in effect, the Minister may revoke the license.

- (2) Notice of revocation of a license pursuant to subsection (1) may be Notice of given by
 - revocation

(a) personal service; or

(b) by registered or certified mail to the last known address of the licensee shown in the records of the Minister.

Deemed service

- (3) A notice mailed pursuant to subsection (2) shall be deemed to be served on the licensee
 - (a) on the date the licensee actually receives the notice; or
 - (b) 5 days after the date of mailing,

whichever is earlier.

Inspector, label

14. (1) No person shall carry out an inspection for the purposes of attaching an identification label unless the person is the holder of a valid HHIp license.

HHIp license

- (2) An applicant for a HHIp license shall
 - (a) complete and submit Form 4A to the Minister;
 - (b) successfully complete any training and examination programs designated by the Minister; and
 - (c) pay an annual renewal license fee of \$50.

License issued

(3) The Minister, if satisfied that an applicant complies with these regulations, may issue a license in Form 6.

Expiry, conditions

- (4) A license issued pursuant to subsection (3)
 - (a) shall expire on January 31 of the year following the date of issue of the license; and
 - (b) may be subject to any conditions the Minister considers necessary for the protection of the environment.

Revocation

(5) Where, in the opinion of the Minister, a licensee has contravened the Act or these regulations, the Minister may revoke the license.

Notice of revocation

- (6) Notice of revocation of a license pursuant to subsection (5) may be given by
 - (a) personal service; or
 - (b) by registered or certified mail to the last known address of the licensee shown in the records of the Minister.

Deemed service

- (7) A notice mailed pursuant to subsection (6) shall be deemed to be served on the licensee
 - (a) on the date the licensee actually receives the notice; or
- (b) 5 days after the date of mailing,

whichever is earlier.

INVENTORY CONTROL

Daily records

15. (1) The operator of a Class 1 liquid or diesel fuel underground storage tank system with a tank of a nominal capacity of 2000 litres or greater shall maintain and reconcile inventory records each day the system is in operation and shall maintain monthly reconciliation summary sheets.

(2) The operator shall retain the inventory records and summary sheets Records retention, at the site of the storage tank system for a minimum of two years, and shall make them available for inspection by the Minister upon request.

inspection

(3) The Minister may advise the Island Regulatory and Appeals Failure to maintain Commission of any failure to maintain the inventory records and records summary sheets as required by this section.

- **16.** (1) The operator of an underground storage tank system which
- Weekly records

(a) has a capacity of 9000 litres or greater; and

(b) is connected to a heating appliance, shall maintain and reconcile weekly inventory records and maintain annual reconciliation summary sheets.

(2) The operator shall retain the inventory records and summary sheets at the site of the storage tank system for a minimum of five years and shall make them available to the Minister for inspection upon request.

Records retention inspection

17. The operator of an aboveground storage tank system at a bulk Visual inspection, petroleum sales outlet shall

- (a) make a visual inspection of the aboveground storage tank system for each day the aboveground storage tank system is in operation, to ensure there has been no damage or deterioration of the system which could result in a leak;
- (b) maintain and reconcile weekly inventory records and maintain annual reconciliation summary sheets; and
- (c) retain the inventory records and summary sheets at the site of the bulk petroleum sales outlet for a minimum of five years and shall make them available to the Minister for inspection upon request.

REPORTING LEAKAGE

18. (1) This section applies to owners and operators of all storage tank Application of systems for which records are required to be kept pursuant sections 15, 16, or 17.

(2) The owner or operator of an underground storage tank system shall Report leakage immediately inform Transport Canada Canadian Coast Guard, when inventory records or reconciliation summary sheets show product loss or water gain that is unaccounted for.

(3) Any person who has reason to believe that petroleum is leaking or *Idem* has leaked from a storage tank system, or that water or other liquid is intruding or has intruded into a storage tank system shall immediately inform Transport Canada Canadian Coast Guard.

(4) Where, in the opinion of the Minister, leakage is occurring in a Leak detection test storage tank system, the Minister may order the owner to conduct a leak detection test.

(5) An owner who receives an order pursuant to subsection (4) shall

Idem

- (a) have the test conducted, at the owner's expense, by a testing agent registered with the Minister;
- (b) in the case of an underground storage tank system, have the test conducted using a liquid-medium leak detection system capable of detecting 380 millilitres product loss per hour; and
- (c) within three days of the test, forward to the Minister the written results of the test, certified by the testing agent.

ALTERATIONS

Approval of alteration

19. (1) No owner of a storage tank system shall alter it or cause it to be altered without first applying for and receiving approval of the alteration from the Minister.

Advance notice of alteration

(2) Subject to subsection (6), an application shall be made on Form 1 not less than two weeks in advance of the proposed starting date of the alteration.

Response

- (3) Subject to subsection (6), the Minister shall indicate in writing to the applicant
 - (a) conditional approval of the alteration, subject to compliance with the minimum installation standards prescribed by these regulations;
 - (b) conditional approval of the alteration, subject to compliance with such conditions as the Minister considers necessary for the protection of the environment; or
 - (c) refusal of the alteration because of the sensitivity of the proposed site, or for any other reason which, in the opinion of the Minister, warrants refusal in order to protect the environment.

Conditional approval, expiry (4) Subject to subsection (5), a conditional approval granted pursuant to subsection (3) shall be valid for a period of twelve months from the date of issue.

Revocation of conditional approval

(5) Where, in the opinion of the Minister, alterations to a storage tank system do not comply with the Act or these regulations, the Minister may revoke the conditional approval of the system, which revocation shall become effective upon notification to the owner.

Emergency alterations

(6) Where the owner of a storage tank system needs to make an emergency alteration to prevent product loss, the owner may apply to the Minister for immediate approval, and the Minister may waive the time frames in subsections (2) and (4), and grant approval subject to any conditions the Minister considers necessary for the protection of the environment.

Precautions

(7) The owner shall take reasonable precautions to prevent and contain spillage of petroleum during alterations.

Notice by licensee

- (8) A licensee shall give written notice to the Minister
 - (a) upon completing an alteration of an aboveground storage tank system as described in subsection (1); and

- (b) at least two days prior to backfilling an altered underground storage tank system.
- (9) Upon receipt of notice pursuant to subsection (8), the Minister may Inspection

- (a) have the storage tank system inspected by an environment officer:
- (b) issue a final approval of the system; and
- (c) where required pursuant to section 2, issue a certificate of registration.

STORAGE TANK UPGRADE, REMOVAL AND MONITORING

20. (1) The owner of an existing steel underground storage tank system Removal, old which is not cathodically protected, shall remove the storage tank system underground tanks from the ground prior to the storage tank system reaching fifteen years of age.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), the owner of an existing non- Exception corroding small capacity storage tank is not required to replace the tank pursuant to this section.

5 years

(3) Where a steel small capacity storage tank

Replacement within

- (a) has a nominal steel thickness of 2.0 mm.;
- (b) has a tank end or a top burner connection; and
- (c) was manufactured fifteen or more years ago,

the owner of the tank shall replace it within five years of the effective date of these regulations.

(4) Where a steel small capacity storage tank

Idem

- (a) has a nominal steel thickness of 2.0 mm.;
- (b) has a bottom outlet burner connection; and
- (c) was manufactured twenty or more years ago,

the owner of the tank shall replace the tank within five years of the effective date of these regulations.

(5) Where a steel small capacity storage tank

Idem

- (a) has a nominal steel thickness of 2.3 mm.;
- (b) has a tank end or top burner connection; and
- (c) was manufactured twenty or more years ago,

the owner of the tank shall replace the tank within five years of the effective date of these regulations.

(6) Where a steel small capacity storage tank

Idem

- (a) has a nominal steel thickness of 2.3 mm.:
- (b) has a bottom outlet burner connection; and
- (c) was manufactured twenty-five or more years ago,

the owner of the tank shall replace the tank within five years of the effective date of these regulations.

(7) The owner of a storage tank system shall remove any subsurface Removal of contamination by a method approved by the Minister.

contaminants

In situ remediation systems

(8) Where the clean up of a storage tank system is done by means of an *in situ* remediation system, the owner shall ensure the *in situ* remediation system is continuously maintained and operated until the clean up has been completed to the satisfaction of the Minister.

Owner responsible for costs

(9) Any costs associated with compliance with subsections (7) and (8) are the responsibility of the storage tank system owner.

Sacrificial anode systems

- **21**. The owner of a sacrificial anode storage tank system shall ensure that maintenance checks are conducted on the system
 - (a) by a corrosion specialist or the corrosion specialist's authorized representative in compliance with the National Standard of Canada CAN 4-S603.1-M85; and
 - (b) at the following times:
 - (i) immediately after installation,
 - (ii) six months after installation, and
 - (iii) once a year thereafter.

Impressed current systems

- 22. The owner of an impressed current storage tank system shall ensure
 - (a) that maintenance checks are conducted on the system in compliance with the Petroleum Association for Conservation of the Canadian Environment (PACE) report No. 87-1, part 5.5(c) and part 6(a) and (c); and
 - (b) that a corrosion specialist or a corrosion specialist's authorized representative is contacted immediately, if
 - (i) the rectifier status lights indicate a problem, or
 - (ii) the controlled parameter charge has a reading greater than 10% of the normal operating condition.

Records, maintenance checks **23.** The owner shall permanently retain all records of maintenance checks at the site of the storage tank system and shall make them available to the Minister for inspection upon request.

Inspection

24. The owner of a large capacity storage tank, as described in section 8, with a capacity of 50,000 litres or greater shall ensure that inspections are conducted in conformance with the interval criteria in section 4.4.2 of API Standard 653.

Idem

25. The owner of a small capacity storage tank shall ensure that an HHI or HHIp licensee conducts an inspection on or before September 1, 2006.

Deficiencies

26. Any deficiencies in a large capacity storage tank identified as a result of the inspection conducted pursuant to section 24 shall be corrected by the owner in compliance with technical supplement CAN/ULC-S601(A) or CAN/ULC-S630(A) or with API Standard 653, as applicable.

Time for correction of deficiencies

- **27.** The owner of a small capacity storage tank for which deficiencies are identified on an inspection pursuant to section 25
 - (a) shall correct the deficiencies;
 - (b) shall ensure that the storage tank and its installation comply with these regulations; and

storage tank.

- (c) shall ensure that the deficiencies are corrected within five years of the effective date of these regulations.
- 28. Where a small capacity storage tank is replaced pursuant to section Removal, leaking 27 or 29, an HHI licensee shall ensure that no water or sludge contamination is transferred from the old tank to the new tank.

aboveground tank

29. Where an inspection made pursuant to section 22 identifies a leaking Replacement, small capacity storage tank, the owner shall replace the tank immediately with an acceptable small capacity storage tank in accordance with these regulations.

leaking tank

- 30. Where an inspection made pursuant to section 25 identifies an Acceptable tank acceptable small capacity storage tank, as described in sections 9, 11 and 20, an HHIp or HHI licensee shall
 - (a) complete the identification label in Form 3A, calculating the expiry date for the tank by reference to section 20;
 - (b) permanently affix the identification label to the vent pipe for the tank identified in the inspection report on Form 7; and
 - (c) complete and submit an inspection report on Form 7 to the Minister within ten days of the inspection.
- 31. Where a deficient small capacity storage tank has been upgraded in Upgraded tank compliance with sections 9, 11 and 20, an HHI licensee shall

(a) complete the identification label in Form 3A, calculating the expiry date for the tank by reference to section 20;

- (b) permanently affix the identification label to the vent pipe for the tank identified in the inspection report on Form 7; and
- (c) complete and submit an inspection report on Form 7 to the Minister within ten days of the inspection.
- 32. No person shall permanently affix an identification label to a small Label meets capacity storage tank except in accordance with these regulations.

33. No person shall alter, re-use, or attempt to alter or re-use an No alteration, reuse identification label that has been permanently affixed to a small capacity

OUT OF SERVICE STORAGE TANKS

- 34. (1) Subject to subsection (2), the owner of a storage tank system Out of service tanks which has been or is to be out of service for a period of six consecutive months or more shall immediately ensure
 - (a) that the tank is emptied of all liquids and purged of all hydrocarbon vapours as per the NFPA 327; and
 - (b) that the fill pipe and other openings are locked.
- (2) The owner of an underground storage tank system which has been Maintenance or will be out of service for a period of six months or more which requires ballasting shall maintain the system during the out-of-service period.

Out of service tanks, permanent

- (3) The owner of an underground storage tank system which has been or is to be out of service for a period of twelve consecutive months or more shall immediately
 - (a) notify the Minister in writing of the location of the tank and permit inspection by the Minister as required; and
 - (b) ensure that a licensee
 - (i) removes the piping from the ground, or purge the piping of flammable vapours and product and permanently seals the end of the piping by capping it,
 - (ii) removes the tank from the ground, and
 - (iii) removes any petroleum-contaminated soil.

Reinstallation

- **35.** (1) No person shall reinstall an underground storage tank which has been removed from the ground unless the tank has been re-certified by its manufacturer according to
 - (a) National Standard of Canada 4-S603.1-M85, "Galvanic Corrosion Protection Systems for Steel Underground Tanks for Flammable and Combustible Liquids"; or
 - (b) National Standard of Canada Technical Supplement CAN 4-S615(A)85 "Refurbishing of Reinforced Plastic Underground Tanks for Petroleum Fuels".

Approval of use

- (2) No person shall use an underground storage tank that has been removed from service unless approved for use by the Minister
 - (a) for aboveground use for petroleum storage; or
 - (b) for re-installation underground inside a precast concrete containment vault that complies with these regulations.

STORAGE TANK DISPOSAL

Disposal

- **36.** The owner of an underground storage tank which has been removed from the ground, shall ensure the identification tag required pursuant to subsection 2(5) remains permanently affixed to the tank and shall, within one month of the removal
 - (a) obtain re-certification and reinstall it pursuant to subsection 35(1);
 - (b) obtain approval of the Minister and use the tank as an aboveground tank pursuant to subsection 35(2);
 - (c) take the following measures:
 - (i) have the tank purged of petroleum and petroleum vapours by a contractor registered with the Minister, using a method approved by the Minister;
 - (ii) have the tank verified as gas-free by a contractor using a gas detection meter approved by the Minister,
 - (iii) perforate the tank, and
 - (iv) dispose of the tank and any contents at a disposal site approved by the Minister or by a method approved by the Minister; or

(d) under conditions acceptable to the Minister, dispose of a tank permanently in the location in which it is installed, by a method approved by the Minister.

GENERAL

37. In any prosecution under these regulations, the material thickness, Manufacturer's capacity, intended purpose and year of manufacture of a storage tank label shall be deemed to be as stated on the manufacturer's label on the tank, unless proven otherwise.

38. Upon request of an environment officer, the owner of a storage tank Inspection or storage tank system, and the owner of the property upon which a storage tank system is located shall permit inspection of the storage tank system, and shall, where necessary, uncover the storage tank system to permit the inspection.

39. The forms referred to in these regulations are set out in the Schedule. Forms

40. The Petroleum Storage Tanks Regulations (EC187/90) are revoked.

Revocation

41. These regulations come into force on June 15, 2001.

SECTION 41 is the effective date.
