




Trends

2004-2006 auto crime incidents in B.C.*

- Theft-of-vehicle claims have declined 26 per cent from 2004 to 2006.
- Theft-of-vehicle claims have declined 19 per cent from 2005 to 2006.
- Vehicle break-in claims have declined 25 per cent from 2004 to 2006.
- Vehicle break-in claims have declined 12 per cent from 2005 to 2006.





*Note: Numbers are rounded but percentages are based on unrounded numbers.

Protecting your vehicle against auto crime

Auto thieves look for an easy target. The average age of a stolen vehicle is approximately 11 years old. Thieves target older vehicles because they don't usually have an effective anti-theft device and they are easy to steal.

You can do your part to keep your vehicle safe by using an anti-theft device and removing any packages or personal property from sight.

- Immobilizers are the most effective way to prevent your vehicle from being stolen.
- Car alarms are most effective in preventing vehicle break-ins.
- Steering wheel locks are a good visual deterrent for auto thieves but offer a lower form of protection.

If your vehicle is at high risk consider layering your protection and using a steering wheel lock in combination with an immobilizer and other visual deterrents.

ROAD SAFETY Auto Crime

Auto crime tips:

- Install an immobilizer.
- Use a steering wheel lock every time you park your vehicle.
- Always close your windows and lock your doors.
- Take your possessions with you.
- Keep your spare keys in your wallet, not in your car.
- In parkades, avoid parking in areas with poor visibility where thieves will feel safe when breaking into your car, elsewhere, park in well-lit areas near pedestrian traffic.
- After opening an automatic gate to underground parking, watch out for thieves waiting to slip inside. Wait for the gate to close behind you.
- Engrave your stereo and other on-board valuables with your driver's licence number.
