COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FUND SUPPORTS COOPERATIVE INITIATIVES

WHITEHORSE – The Government of Yukon Community Development Fund (CDF) has awarded \$140,146 of Tier 1 funding to a range of cooperative initiatives that aim at bringing Yukoners together to share ideas and cultivate stronger communities.

"I am increasingly impressed with the enthusiasm demonstrated by Yukoners who are working to nurture their communities," Economic Development Minister Jim Kenyon said. "This government is committed to maintaining the Community Development Fund, which supports cooperation and economic development in Yukon."

The Yukon Volunteer Bureau/Yukon Development Education Centre, in partnership with Carcross/ Tagish First Nation, received \$19,593 for the training and implementation of community engagement techniques. With an emphasis on both capacity development and community development, this project focuses on building local expertise that increases Yukoners' employability.

"This is an exciting opportunity for non-profit organizations and First Nations to collaborate and bring expertise to the Yukon and to build the skills of several organizations, simultaneously," Angela Walkley, president of the Yukon Development Education Center, said. "CDF is enabling different groups to work together, with a common interest on common ground."

The Dawson City Chamber of Commerce received \$19,243 to develop both a strategic and implementation plan. This project aims to engage a multitude of Dawson City businesses in planning for future growth. With a strong focus on community engagement and the strengthening of social networks, the Dawson City Chamber of Commerce aims to foster a model of cooperation and a shared vision for local economic growth.

"We are trying to cultivate a sound economic environment for people to want to do business here," Dina Grenon, volunteer and member of the Dawson City Chamber of Commerce, said. "The CDF funding will help provide direction to our organization, which in turn will provide services and support to all Dawson City businesses."

The primary goal of the Community Development Fund is to provide funding to Yukon groups, associations and organizations for projects and events that provide long-term benefit and value to Yukon communities.

The next intake deadline for CDF funding is May 15. This intake is for both Tier 1 (up to \$20,000) and Tier 2 (\$20,001 to \$75,000) projects.
