

#### NOVA SCOTIA HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE 2006 CENSUS OF CANADA

#### **Aboriginal Peoples**

- In 2006 there were 24,175 people in Nova Scotia with an Aboriginal identity representing 2.7% of the total provincial population. In 2001 there were 17,015 people with an Aboriginal identity representing 1.9% of the total population.
- In 2006, the Aboriginal identity population increased 42.1% over the previous census. The non-Aboriginal population declined by 0.2% over the same period.
- The aboriginal identity population is comprised of three sub groups: North American Indian (63%); Metis (31.8%); Inuit (1.3%); and others (3.8%).
- The number of Registered Indians (12,425) increased 14.3% over 2001 and make up 50.8% of the Aboriginal identity population.
- In the aboriginal community, 4,980 people have knowledge of an aboriginal language, an increase of 3.8% over 2001. However, the percentage of aboriginals with knowledge of an aboriginal language declined 7.6 percentage points to 20.6%.
- The largest reserve in Nova Scotia is Eskasoni with an aboriginal population of 2,930 people followed by Indian Brook with 975 people, Membertou with 685 people, Millbrook with 640 people and Whycocomagh with 615 people. There are twenty-six reserves listed in the release tables.
- Population on Reserves increased 16.5% over 2001 to 8,770 people: Aboriginal identified = 8,305; non-Aboriginal = 465. North American Indians form the highest number of residents on reserves at 83.8% of the total.
- Less than a third (32.6%) of the Aboriginal identity population in the province live on reserve. Of the 67.4% who live off reserve, slightly less than half live in rural areas (47%) and slightly more than half live in urban areas (53%).
- The Aboriginal population is much younger than the Nova Scotia population as a whole. The median age for Nova Scotia's Aboriginal population in 2006 was 29.5 years while the median age for the Non-Aboriginal population was 41.8 years.
- Of the Aboriginal identity group, 44% are under the age of 25 in 2006. In Nova Scotia as a whole, 29.3% of the population as under 25 years of age.
