AUTHORITY TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT

Pursuant to clause 10(d) of the *Executive Council Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. E-12 Council authorized the Minister of Transportation and Public Works to enter into an agreement with the Republic of France, as represented by the Minister of Foreign and European Affairs, for the purpose of recognizing each other's driver's licenses and allowing for the exchange of driver's licenses to persons who have held a driver's license issued by either France or Prince Edward Island, and who have moved to and are now residing in the other jurisdiction, such as more particularly described in the draft agreement.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND LANDS PROTECTION ACT PETITION TO ACQUIRE A LAND HOLDING MARWOOD PROPERTIES INC. (APPROVAL)

Pursuant to section 5 and section 9 of the *Prince Edward Island Lands Protection Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. L-5 Council granted permission to Marwood Properties Inc. of Georgetown, Prince Edward Island to acquire a land holding of approximately one hundred (100) acres of land in Lot 59, Kings County, Province of Prince Edward Island, being acquired from the Estates of John Gillis of Halifax, Nova Scotia; Samuel Gillis of Kilmuir, Prince Edward Island; Katherine G. Smith of Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island; Sadie G. White of Murray Harbour, Prince Edward Island; and Charles Gillies of Montreal, Quebec; and their heirs, including: Margaret Gillies of Halifax, Nova Scotia; John Charles Gillies of Dartmouth, Nova Scotia; Patricia Ann Trus of Frankford, Ontario; Flora Gillies of Halifax, Nova Scotia; and Ian Gillies of North York, Ontario; PROVIDED THAT the said real property is identified for non-development use pursuant to the Land Identification Regulations (EC606/95) made under the said Act.

# PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND LANDS PROTECTION ACT PROPERTY NO. 055202, LOT 6, PRINCE COUNTY IDENTIFICATION FOR NON-DEVELOPMENT USE AMENDMENT

Pursuant to subsection 9(2) of the *Prince Edward Island Lands Protection Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. L-5, Council amended the condition of non-development use pursuant to section 2 of the Land Identification Regulations (EC606/95) in respect of approximately fifty-one decimal five seven (51.57) acres of land, being Provincial Property No. 055202 located in Lot 6, Prince County, Prince Edward Island and currently owned by Smallman's Forestry & Feed Lot Ltd. of O'Leary, Prince Edward Island.

Council noted that this amendment will enable subdivision of a parcel of land of approximately three decimal five (3.5) acres and is SUBJECT TO the subdivided parcel being consolidated with the adjacent Provincial Property No. 821116. Further, Council determined that following subdivision, identification for non-development use shall continue to apply to the remaining land.

This Order-in-Council comes into force on 22 January 2008.

#### LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSES ACT REGULATIONS AMENDMENT

Pursuant to section 9 of the *Licensed Practical Nurses Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. L-10.1, and every other enabling power, Council approved the following regulations made by the Prince Edward Island Licensed Practical Nurses Registration Board, after consultation with the Licensed Practical Nurses Association of Prince Edward Island:

#### ROADS ACT HIGHWAY ACCESS REGULATIONS AMENDMENT

Pursuant to section 29 of the *Roads Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. R-15 Council made the following regulations:

- 1. Schedule C-3, Local (Class 3) Highways, of the *Roads Act* Highway Access Regulations (EC580/95) is amended by the addition of the following after subsection 1(364):
- (364.1) **New Road RI41068:** The New Road commencing at the intersection of Route 119 in the settlement of Lower Bedeque for a distance of 0.4 km.
- 2. Schedule D, Seasonal Highways, of the regulations is amended by the revocation of subsection 1(624) and the substitution of the following:

(624) **Road Index 41068:** Road Index 41068 in the settlement of Lower Bedeque commencing at the intersection of Route 112 for a distance of 1.6 km.

3. These regulations come into force February 2, 2008.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

This amendment will reclassify 0.4 km of the New Road (RI41068) in the settlement of Lower Bedeque from Class "D", Seasonal Road to Class C-3, Local unpaved road and enable the Department of Transportation and Public Works to provide year-round maintenance.

- **1.** In these regulations, "Act" means the *Securities Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Act, defined Cap. S-3.1.
- **2.** (1) Notice of every rule made by the Minister under section 169 of Publication of rules the Act shall be published in the Gazette, and the Superintendent shall
  - (a) publish the rule electronically; and
  - (b) ensure that the rule is available to the public in the office of the Superintendent.

(2) A rule made by the Minister under section 169 of the Act comes Effective date into effect fifteen days after its approval by the Minister or on the effective date stated in the rule, whichever is later.

(3) A rule made by the Minister under section 169 of the Act which Forms adopted adopts or incorporates a national or multilateral instrument of the Canadian Securities Administrators, adopts or incorporates, as amended from time to time, the forms made by the Canadian Securities Administrators for use under the national or multilateral instrument.

3. For any order made by the Superintendent in relation to investigation Investigation costs costs under section 63 of the Act, the following fees and charges are recoverable:

- (a) \$50 per hour per person for time spent on an investigation by the Superintendent or by any delegate of the Superintendent;
- (b) for disbursements properly incurred by the Superintendent for an investigation, the total amount disbursed;
- (c) fees properly incurred by the Superintendent for a person appointed to make an investigation under section 30 of the Act;
- (d) for disbursements properly incurred by a person appointed to make an investigation under section 30 of the Act, the total amount disbursed:
- (e) fees properly incurred by the Superintendent for legal services;
- (f) for disbursements properly incurred in connection with the provision of legal services, the total amount disbursed.
- 4. For any order made by the Superintendent in relation to hearing costs Hearing costs under section 63 of the Act, the following fees and charges are recoverable:

- (a) \$1000 for each day or partial day of hearing;
- (b) \$50 per hour for the Superintendent or for each delegate of the Superintendent for time spent at a hearing;
- (c) for disbursements properly incurred by the Superintendent or by any delegate of the Superintendent for a hearing, the total amount disbursed:
- (d) fees properly incurred by the Superintendent for a witness;
- (e) for disbursements properly incurred by a witness, the total amount disbursed;
- (f) fees properly incurred by the Superintendent for legal services;
- (g) for disbursements properly incurred in connection with the provision of legal services, the total amount disbursed.
- 5. For each review of a market participant under section 85, the Market participant following fees and charges are recoverable:

- (a) a fee of \$50 per hour for the Superintendent and for each delegate of the Superintendent involved in the review;
- (b) for disbursements properly incurred by the Superintendent for a compliance review, the total amount disbursed;
- (c) fees paid to a person appointed to conduct a review under section 85 of the Act;
- (d) for disbursements properly incurred by a person appointed to conduct a review under section 85 of the Act, the total amount disbursed:
- (e) fees paid for legal services;
- (f) for disbursements properly incurred in connection with the provision of legal services, the total amount disbursed.
- **6.** These regulations come into force on March 17, 2008.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

SECTION 1 sets out a definition for the word "Act".

**SECTION 2** establishes the publication requirements for the rules made by the Minister. This section also explains when a rule comes into force. In addition, this section indicates that if a rule adopts or incorporates a national or multilateral instrument of the Canadian Securities Administrators, the rule also adopts or incorporates by reference the forms made by the Canadian Securities Administrators for use under the national or multilateral instrument.

**SECTIONS 3 AND 4** set out the fees and charges that any order made by the Superintendent under section 63 of the Act may impose in relation to investigation and hearing costs.

**SECTION 5** sets out the fees and charges that the Superintendent may, under section 85 of the Act, require a market participant who is the subject of a review to pay.

**SECTION 6** provides for the commencement of these regulations.

V-3.1, and where such an endorsement is made the provisions of section 11 of the Summary Proceedings Act have effect.

- 5. The Summary Proceedings Act Ticket Regulations (EC321/01) are Revocation revoked.
