Core Training

The Division has identified certain basic core training that staff are required to complete. The core training varies, depending upon the section of the division in which the staff member works. The Divisional Training Committee schedules core training based upon demand so that staff can access the required training.

Graduates of the Youth Worker Program who have completed the following sessions are credited with these courses towards their core training: Boundaries, Occupational Health and Safety, Suicide Prevention, and Workplace Hazardous Materials Information Systems.

Graduates of the Correctional Officer Program are who have completed the following sessions are credited with the following courses towards their core training: Boundaries, Chemical Dependency, Oleoresin Capsicum Spray, Suicide Prevention, and Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System.

Certain core training requires re-certification at regular intervals. These courses include: First Aid/CPR (every three years), Oleoresin Capsicum (every two years), Suicide Prevention (every five years), Fire Training (every three years), and Conflict Crisis Intervention (every three years).

In addition to core training, the Division offers other relevant training to enhance the knowledge and skills of staff. This calendar outlines both core and supplementary training offered under the auspices of the Divisional Training Committee.

As part of the Performance Development Process, staff are expected to identify their learning needs and to develop a plan with their supervisor to meet these needs.

SEXUAL ABUSE: TREATMENT FOR OFFENDERS/ IMPACT ON SURVIVORS

Treatment For Offenders:

This workshop provides participants with general profiles outlining the characteristics, including motivation and risk factors, of the different categories of sex offenders, i.e. child molester, rapist, and hands off offender. There will be a description of current approaches to treatment, with an emphasis on those used at the PEI Community Justice Resource Centre. There will be a discussion of ways in which various staff coming into contact with sex offenders can facilitate treatment as well as things that should be avoided in responding to sex offenders.

This workshop will allow participants the opportunity to learn about the broad area of sexual assault, the operation of the justice system in dealing with sexual assault, the extent of this behaviour from a statistical perspective, and a summary of the dynamics of sex offenders. It will also provide participants the opportunity to explore their own belief systems when working with sex offenders.

Impact on Survivors:

This course gives a basic understanding of the ways that adults, both male and female, continue to be affected by the experience of having been sexually abused as a child. There will be a particular focus on the maladaptive ways in which adolescent and adult males deal with the unresolved feelings produced by the abuse.
