Our world has changed dramatically since 1929 when the first Commerce degree was granted here. It used to be that, when the university moved here to the campus, it seemed too far away from the city.

Today, it is at the centre of research and new ideas. Now, with this \$20 million gift to the Sauder School of Business, it will be a centre not just for British Columbians, but also a centre of learning and research for the world.
