May 17 to 21 **Festival international** de musique actuelle (international new music festival)

Victoriaville (Centre-du-Québec) fimav.qc.ca

This festival of progressive music packs 26 concerts into five days with some 180 musicians from a dozen countries taking part. Jazz, rock, electroacoustic and contemporary music and improvisation are all part of the line-up for this, the largest festival of its kind in North America.

May 27 to June 3

Montréal Bike Fest velo.gc.ca

The Bike Fest offers a week of varied cycling activities. Two very special rides make for a spectacular grand finale: 11,000 cyclists take the streets for Un tour la nuit (a night tour), followed by the *Tour de l'Île de* Montréal, the largest cycling event in North America, with roughly 30,000 participants turning out for a panoramic 45 km circuit.

June 2

Women's Cycling World Cup Montréal - coupe-du-monde-cyclisme.org

The Mount Everest of cycling! This prestigious race spans multiple continents: Oceania, Europe and the Americas. Montréal is proud to welcome the only trial of the Women's Cycling World Cup to be held in the Americas.

June 8 to 10 Grand Prix du Canada Montréal – grandprix.ca

Canada's only Formula 1 race, the Grand *Prix* brings the world's best auto racers to Montréal to test their mettle on the demanding circuit Gilles-Villeneuve.

Artists from here and beyond meet at the Centre de la nature de Laval to celebrate the largest gathering of choirs and vocal groups in North America.

This festival embraces nearly 40 artists from a dozen communities. The entire village joins in on the fun, alongside tourists eager to hear the numerous performers on the different stages.

June 20 to July 1 Grand Rire

This popular comedy festival leaves Québec City visitors rolling in the aisles – and the streets! With galas and numerous performances indoors and out, by artists from Québec and elsewhere, festivalgoers are guaranteed a joyous time.

June 20 to July 28

International des Feux Loto-Québec Montréal

The most dazzling nights of the summer are to be found at the 23rd edition of this, Montréal's renowned international fireworks competition, held in the La Ronde amusement park on Île St-Hélène.

June 21 to August 12

Orford Festival Orford (Eastern Townships) arts-orford.org

Presented each summer by the Orford Arts Centre, this festival is an eight-week celebration of classical music featuring some 40 concerts and an opera. Theme weekends. Dinner-concerts and free performances.

June 23 to August 26

Domaine Forget International Festival Saint-Irénée (Charlevoix) www.domaineforget.com

A classical and jazz music festival held each summer on the scenic shores of Charlevoix. Over a two-month period, shows and concerts enable spectators to discover the talents of international stars, renowned Québec artists, and promising young musicians.

June 23 to September 30 International Garden Festival

A North American first, this event revolves around the creation of contemporary gardens. Enjoy temporary gardens designed by architects, landscape architects, and artists from the world over.

The 69th edition of this international-calibre sporting and cultural festival includes hydroplane races divided into eight classes, and boats boasting breakneck top speeds of 250 km/h.

July 7 to August 5 Festival de Lanaudière Joliette (Lanaudière) www.lanaudiere.org

Recognized as one of the most prestigious classical music events in North America, this festival spotlights soloists of national and international renown. Concerts and recitals are held at the Lanaudière amphitheatre in Joliette, as well as in churches across the region.

Fête du Lac des Nations

Sherbrooke (Eastern Townships) fetedulacdesnations.com

Now celebrating its 26th year, and with more than 50 shows on five stages, the *Fête* includes the country's only pan-Canadian fireworks competition. Check out the attractions and the handicrafts village. Fun for one and all!

July 12 to 22 Festival international Nuits d'Afrique

A world-class event devoted to the music of Africa, the Antilles and the Caribbean. More than 400 artists and thousands of visitors meet for numerous indoor and outdoor shows, as well as workshops, handicraft sales, an African market, and alluring exotic cuisine.



July 12 to 22

Just For Laughs Festival Montréal – hahaha.com



The world's biggest comedy festival keeps Montréal in stitches. Some 700 international artists perform at galas, theatre events, stand-up shows and in downtown streets. Over 2 million festivalgoers flock to the festival's 1,500 shows, most of which are outdoors and free.

Mid-July

International Blues Festival Tremblant (Laurentides) – tremblant.ca

The International Blues Festival presents 10 days of free outdoor concerts in the world-class resort of Mont-Tremblant. At night, the area's bars and restaurants take over, serving up concerts of their own in a wildly festive atmosphere. Celebrate summer by discovering some of today's most exciting blues artists.

July 20 to 29

The 53rd Lake Saint-Jean International Swimming Marathon

The celebration has four components: the *Divers/Cité Festival, Grand Rendez-vous, community days* and the *Pride Parade.* The festivities aim to underscore the richness of diversity in a spirit of sharing, solidarity and openness.


