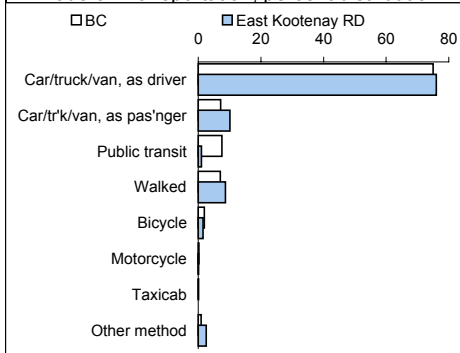

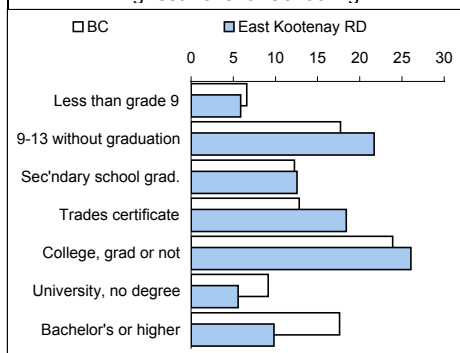

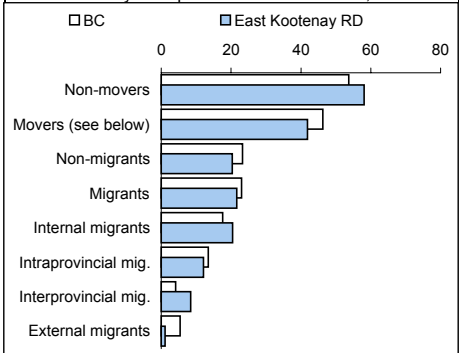

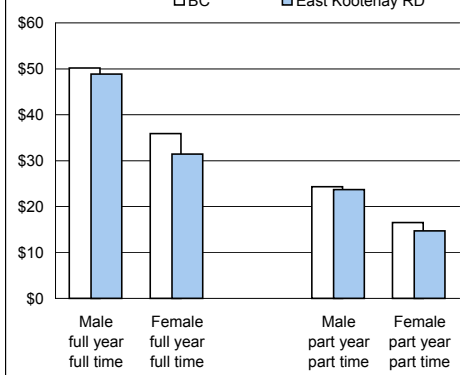
5-Year Mobility of Population 5 Years & Older, % distrib.

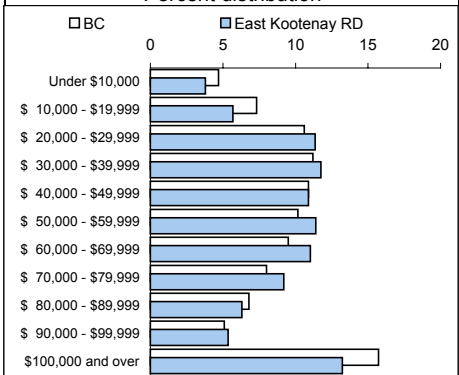

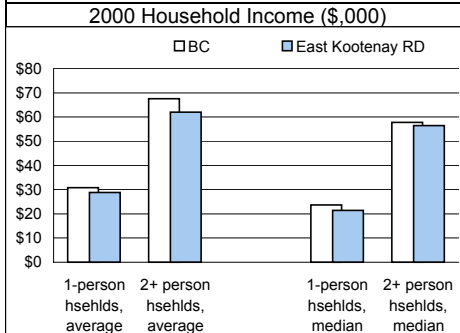
2000 Family Income Groups, All Census Families

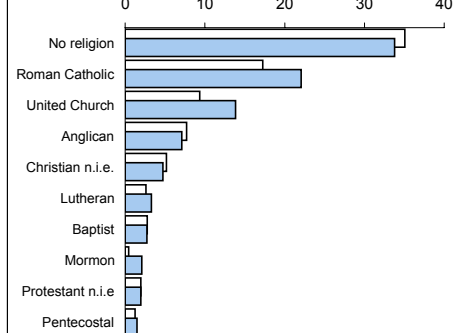
2000 Household Income (\$,000)
