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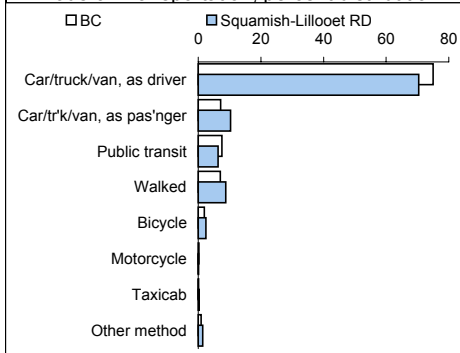

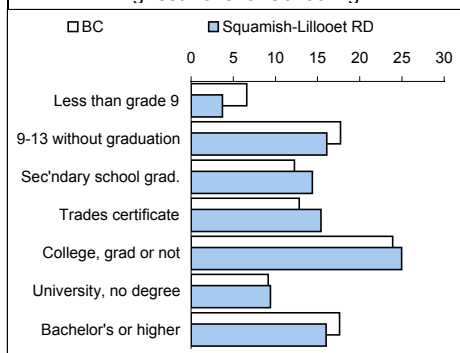

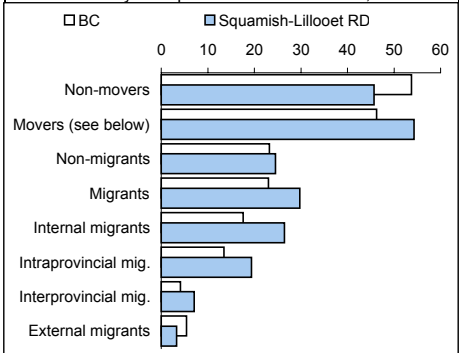

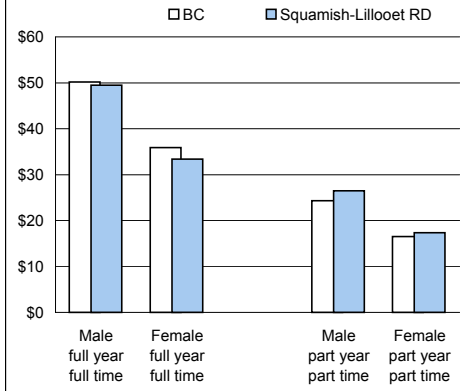
5-Year Mobility of Population 5 Years & Older, % distrib.

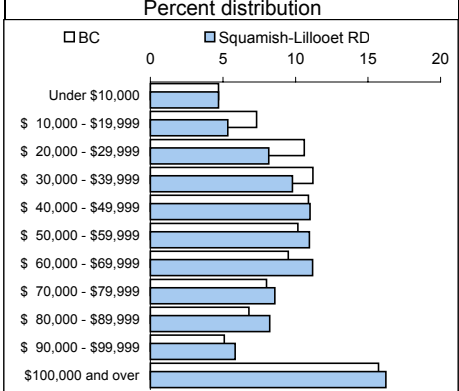

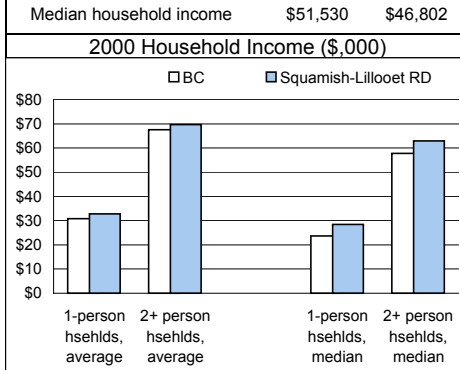

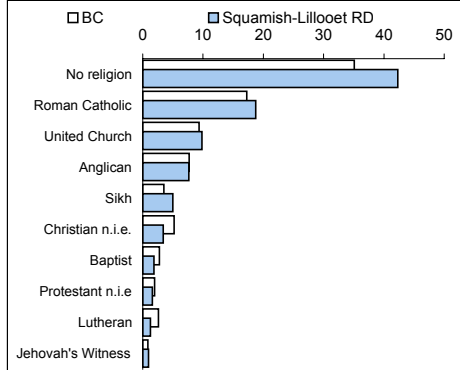
2000 Household Income (\$,000)

Incidence of low income - the percentage of a specific group below Statistics Canada's low income cut-offs (LICO).

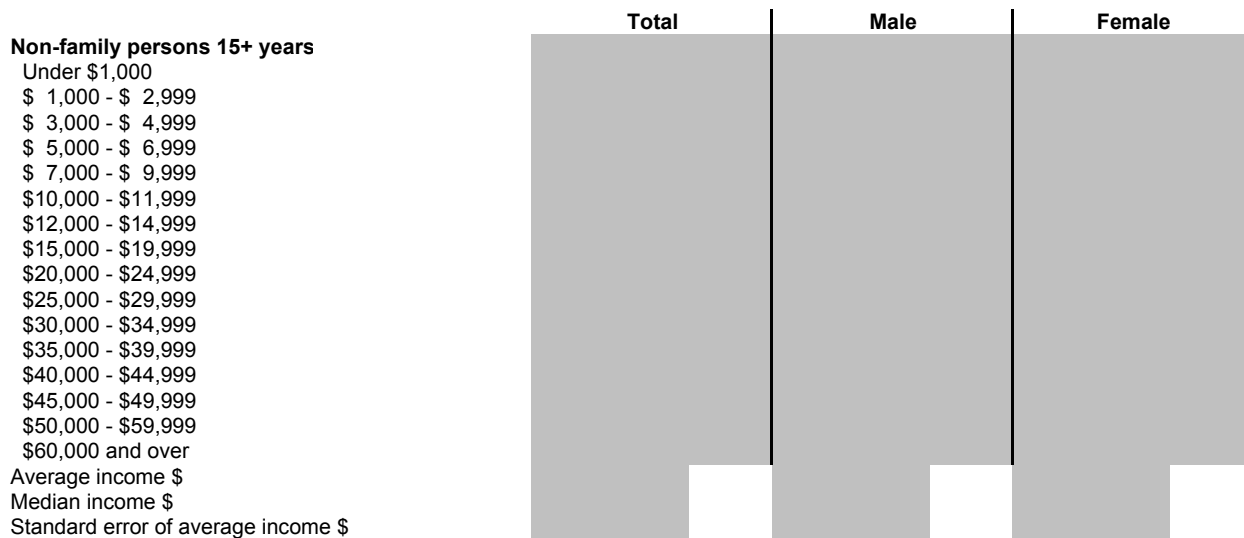
