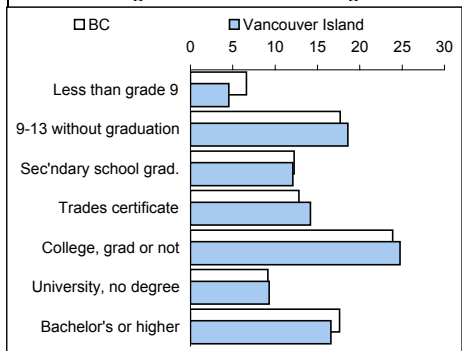

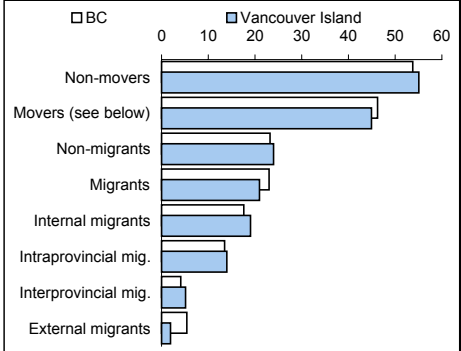

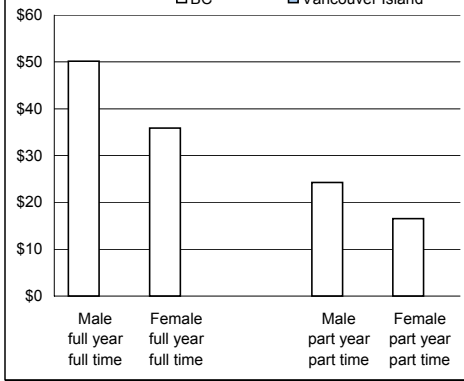
5-Year Mobility of Population 5 Years & Older, % distrib.

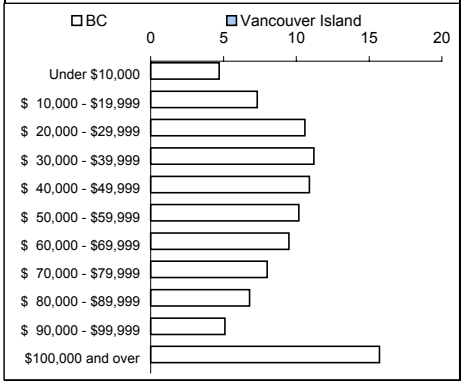

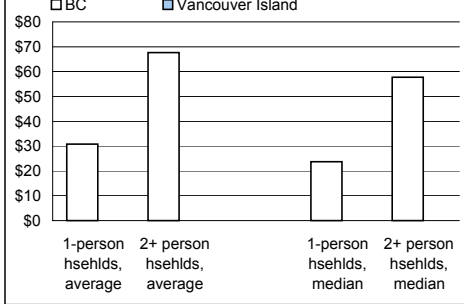

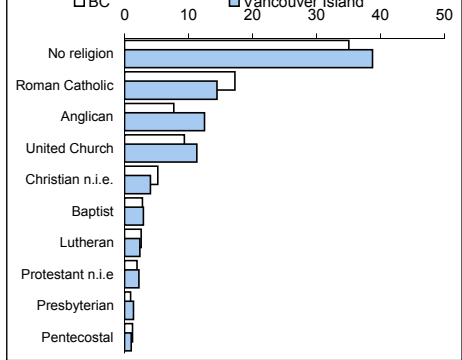
