## Issue 2: Age of Children in Families

- Six out of ten families in British Columbia have children (never-married sons and daughters) living at home.
- In 22 per cent of families with children living at home, all of the children are aged 18 or over.

> Husband-Wife Families Have Younger Children Than Single Parent Families


- Single parents are more likely than two-parent families to have only older children (aged 18 or more) living at home. In 1991, 38 per cent of single fathers and 31 per cent of single mothers fit into this category, compared to only 20 per cent of husband-wife families.
- Husband-wife families typically have younger children than lone parents. In 38 per cent of all two-parent families, the youngest child is less than six years old. For single mothers and fathers, the comparable statistics are 26 and 15 per cent, respectively.
- A possible explanation of the variation in the ages of children living in different types of families is that couples may be less likely to separate or divorce when their children are very young.
- The relative number of single fathers with young children is growing. In 1991, 15 per cent of single fathers had a child less than six years old, up from 13.5 per cent in 1986.
