
Issue 10: Collective Dwellings

• 48,865 British Columbians (or 1.5 per cent of the total population) live in collective dwellings such as hospitals, correctional institutions, lodging and rooming houses, work and military camps and religious colonies.



- The majority (78 per cent) of women who live in collective dwellings are 55 or older. Only 45 per cent of male residents fall into this age category.
- About one per cent of British Columbia's women are living in special care homes, double the corresponding percentage for men. Seven out of ten residents of special care homes are women.
- Men are more likely than women to live in other institutions. For example, 62 per cent of residents of general, psychiatric and other hospitals who are under the age of 55 are male.
- A growing number of women are involved in military service. In 1986, women accounted for only 8 per cent of residents of military camps; by 1991, the share had risen to 12 per cent.
- Seven out of every ten residents of rooming houses and hotels are male.
- Since federal prison facilities for women are located outside British Columbia, the majority (97 per cent) of correctional institution inmates are male.
