
Issue 22: Aboriginal On and Off Reserve

- In order to provide a more accurate assessment of the Aboriginal population living on and off Indian reserves, the data contained in this report includes the estimated population that was unenumerated in the 1991 and 1986 Censuses.
- The total population, both native and non-native, residing on Indian reserves in 1991 was 54,228, an increase of 14.5 per cent over 1986.

One Quarter of the Population Living on Reserves is Non-Aboriginal



- In 1991 only 40,418, or 24 per cent of the Aboriginal population in B.C. lived on Indian reserves, down from 28 per cent in 1986.
- Over 92 per cent of the Aboriginals living on reserve were single origin North American Indians. However, only 52 per cent of single origin North American Indians live on reserve.
- British Columbia is unique among the provinces in that over 25% of the population on reserves do not have any Aboriginal ancestry. A few of these 13,810 non-Aboriginals on reserves can be attributed to Native and non-Native marriages, but the majority of non-Aboriginal people on reserve are non-Natives living in non-Native communities on land leased from the reserves.
- The proportion of non-Aboriginal population living on Indian reserves is increasing. Between 1986 and 1991 their numbers increased by 34 per cent compared to the Aboriginal population increase of 9 per cent.
