Labour Force Statistics November 2003

HIGHLIGHTS

All labour force statistics in this Highlights article are seasonally adjusted, unless otherwise indicated

- Employment in B.C. was little changed from November, following a strong gain of 30,100 in October. So far this year, as measured since December 2002, employment in B.C. has grown by 53,300 or 2.7%. This growth in employment in B.C. since December 2002 led all provinces, followed by PEI (up 2.2%) and Alberta (up 2.0%).
- On an actual basis, average employment for the first 11 months of 2003 compared to the same period in 2002, was up in B.C. by 2.4%, compared to 2.2% for Canada overall. On this basis, Alberta led the country with employment growth of 2.9%.
- The unemployment rate fell to 7.6% in November, down from 7.8% in October. This reflects a 4,500 decrease in the number of unemployed persons and no change in the number of employed. The labour force participation rate fell slightly to 65.5% from 65.8% in October.

- The B.C. unemployment rate for youth aged 15-24 fell to 12.8% in November, down from 13.6% in October.
- Full-time employment in November rose in B.C. by 8,100, but this was offset by a decrease in part-time work. Since December 2002, full-time in employment in B.C. has expanded by 79,700, while parttime employment has decreased by 26,500.
- Canadian employment increased by 0.2% (up 54,100) in November. Two-thirds of this gain was in full-time employment. Regionally, Canada's overall employment gains in November were concentrated in Quebec. The only provinces experiencing significant declines in employment in November were Newfoundland and Manitoba.
