## Labour Force Statistics February 2004

## HIGHLIGHTS

All labour force statistics in this Highlights article are seasonally adjusted, unless otherwise indicated

- Employment in B.C. in February 2004 fell by 36,400 from January, with the decrease being shared equally between full and part-time employment.
- Despite the sharp decrease in employment in February, the estimated number of unemployed persons increased by only 11,100. This combined to produce a fall in the size of the labour force, and a decline in the labour force participation rate. The unemployment rate rose to 7.9 per cent in February from 7.3 per cent in January.
- The largest employment declines in BC in February were seen in retail and wholesale trade (down 20,700) and construction (down 6,000). By contrast, employment increases were seen in professional, scientific and technical services (up 3,400) and accommodation, food and beverage services (5,800).
- Employment for Canada overall was little changed for the second straight month, and the national unemployment rate remained at 7.4 per cent.
