Labour Force Statistics June 2005

HIGHLIGHTS

All labour force statistics in this Highlights article are seasonally adjusted, unless otherwise indicated

- British Columbia's unemployment rate in June edged up 0.1 percentage points to 5.8%, after three consecutive declines since February. It is, however, still the second lowest rate since 1981.
- Canada's unemployment rate dropped 0.1 percentage points to 6.7 percent in June.
- BC's youth unemployment rate continues to decline, reaching a fifteen-year low at 10.8 percent in June.
- The unemployment rate for those 25 years and older rose slightly from 4.7 percent in May to 4.8 percent in June.
- The labour force participation rate decreased slightly from 65.7 percent in May to 65.5 percent in June.
- In June, the percentage of part-time workers rose to 21.4 percent. This was offset by a decrease in the amount of full-time employment, which suffered a loss of 31, 900 jobs.

- Among Service producing industries, there was a loss of 3, 300 jobs. The largest loss was in the Retail and Wholesale Trade producing industries (6,700 jobs).
- Within the Goods sector, there was a total loss of 2, 400 jobs. A large loss was felt in Manufacturing (3, 200), while Construction lost 2, 000 jobs.
- When comparing the number of employed with the size of the working age population, **B.C.'s employment rate decreased over the month from 62.0 percent to 61.7 percent.** Alberta continues to have the highest rate of employment among provinces at 69.9 percent.
