Since 1998, with a view to ensuring the future of its resources and the sustainable management of its lands, Réserve faunique Papineau-Labelle has invested considerable time and money to acquire knowledge and carry out numerous wildlife management projects.


## Aquatic management:

- 70 speckled trout spawning areas
- lake trout spawning area (Lac Ernest)
- tens of thousands of speckled trout eggs yearly implanted in spawning areas from 1999 to 2006

### Land management:

- 5 managed alder groves for American woodcock reproduction
- 2 km of small game hunting trails
- 13 km of interpretation trails
- duck nesting boxes
