

# Nisga'a and the Northwest Health Service Delivery Area

The Nisga'a Treaty is a negotiated agreement between the Nisga'a Nation, the Government of British Columbia (B.C.) and the Government of Canada. The last step needed to give legal effect to the Treaty took place on April 13, 2000, when Parliament passed the Nisga'a Final Agreement Act.

The Nisga'a Treaty provides for an open, democratic and accountable Nisga'a Government. It includes representation for all Nisga'a through the Nisga'a Lisims Government, four Village Governments, and three urban locals which provide a voice for Nisga'a citizens who do not live in the Nass Valley.




Children 0-14 Years
As a Percent of Total Population





# Seniors 65+ Years As a Percent of Total Population




# Young Children 0-4 Years As a Percent of Total Population





Age 18-24, between 2000 and 2001








## % of Population Age 25-64 with High School Graduation or Higher





#### % of Population Age 25-64 with High School Graduation plus Post Secondary Completion







#### % of Population Age 15-24 Who Either Worked and/or Attended School between September 2000 and May 2001




#### Nisga'a Lands Aboriginal Male Population Age 15-24



#### Northwest HSDA 51 Non-Aboriginal Male Population Age 15-24




# % of Population Age 15-24 Who Both Worked and Attended School between September 2000 and May 2001



#### Northwest HSDA 51 Non-Aboriginal Female Population Age 15-24





#### % of Population Who Worked in 2000




#### % of Population Who Worked 40+ Weeks Full-time in 2000






#### % of Experienced Labour Force in Management, Professional & Other High Skill Occupations By Sex By Age

## % Shortfall<sup>1</sup> of Nisga'a Lands Aboriginal People Compared to their Representation in the Workforce






#### Average Employment Income for Technical & Other High Skilled Occupations For Those Working 40+ Weeks Mostly Full-time, 2000










# Percent of Families with Children Under Age 19 That are Lone Parent Families




#### % with Housing Needing Major Repair 2001
