Arranging Your Infoline service

Infoline is BC Stats' highly successful *free* weekly information bulletin. Published since 1995 it has become an essential tool for executives, managers, analysts, libraries, businesses and media. It is our most widely distributed and timely review of statistical releases and events that shape or describe the economic and social fabric of British Columbia.

There are a number of ways to get your own copy.

① You can arrange for **email** delivery of a PDF file to your electronic mailbox. Simply email us at:

bcstats.infoline@gov.bc.ca.

Please provide your name, organization and phone number. We gather this information so that we can contact you if we experience problems transmitting to you. Expect delivery by Saturday morning following the date of release—usually on Friday afternoons. This method assures the highest possible quality if you choose to print the document.

② You can choose to have us fax your copy. Simply email us at:

bcstats.infoline@gov.bc.ca

Please provide your name, organization, fax number and phone number. We gather this information so that we can contact you if we experience problems transmitting to you. We commence the broadcast on Saturday mornings, but since several hundred recipients are in the queue and our fax server has only three lines out, clients choosing this route may ex-

perience considerable delay — especially if the issue contains an unusually large report. Since this form of electronic transfer may be subject to 'line noise' any time during the several minutes of a transmission, there is the chance of failure and restart that adds to paper consumption. Finally, this method produces the lowest quality print results

③ You can choose to **pull** your copy from our web site. This is the same PDF file that would be emailed. From our home page, choose the link to Infoline in the blue navigation bar near the top-left of the screen. All issues since January 1997 are archived on our site. Since Infoline is not finalized until late Friday afternoons, it is not possible to make it available on our site until the following Monday morning. As with the email version, this method assures the highest possible quality if you choose to print the document.
