## Focus on BC Aboriginals: A Youthful Population

## $50 \%$ of Aboriginal People in British Columbia Are Less Than 25 Years Old



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- In 1996, 3.8 per cent of the population in British Columbia reported an aboriginal identity.
- The age structure of the Aboriginal community is very different from that of the non-aboriginal population. Almost fifty per cent of the aboriginal population is less than 25 years old compared to just over 32 per cent of the non-aboriginal population.
- Children under the age of five make up 10.8 per cent of the aboriginal population and only 6.1 per cent of the non-
aboriginal population. Although the fertility rate of Aboriginal women is higher than that of non-aboriginal women, the gap between the two has continued to narrow over time and forecasters expect that trend will continue.
- While the proportion of young Aboriginals is higher than that of non-aboriginals, the reverse is true when looking at the elderly population. Aboriginals 55 years of age and over constitute 8.5 per cent of aboriginal population while in the non native community the elderly account for 21.3 per cent.
