Domestic Abuse: Theoretical Foundations

This workshop offers a practical and theoretical framework crucial to understanding domestic abuse. encompasses counselling issues relevant to understanding the experience of women who have been abused (the psychological process of abuse), child witnesses of abuse (consequences of witnessing, why it's hard for kids to talk), and men who have abused their partners (why men abuse, engaging with men who abuse) as well as assessing for abuse, identifying its effects, addressing safety, and applying interventions.
