NOTICE RE APPEAL

1. If you wish to appeal this decision, and this decision was made by a court officer:

(A) If you were not present at the hearing, you must first obtain leave to appeal from a judge and you must file an Application for Leave to Appeal and Notice of Appeal (Form 76I) within 30 days of the date of signing of this certificate.

(B) If you were present at the hearing you must file a Notice of Appeal (Form 76H) within 30 days of the date of signing of this certificate.

(C) The appeal shall be a new trial before a judge who may make any decision that the court officer who heard the claim or counterclaim could have made, including a decision less favourable to you than the decision that was made.

2. If you wish to appeal this decision and this decision was made by a judge, you may with leave of a judge of the Court of Appeal appeal the decision to the Court of Appeal on a question of law only, within 30 days from the time when this certificate was signed.
