CHAPTER 7 – TUITION FEES

7.0 Background

The information presented on tuition fees was obtained from a variety of sources. The weighted university tuition fee information was taken from Statistics Canada's annual *Tuition and Living Accommodations Survey*. Statistics Canada is considered to be the best data source when making national comparisons. This data are found in Tables 7.1.1 and 7.2.1. Additional tuition fee information is found in Tables 7.1.2, 7.2.2 and 7.3.1 and was provided by the institutions annually.

Statistics Canada weighted tuition fees using enrollment data. Weighting tuition fees provides an accurate and reliable indicator of the amount paid by the majority of students, using a historical perspective. A weighted average considers the proportion of students in each field of study, allowing for a consistent view of fees over time. It is noted that weighting at the provincial and institutional levels is different. Institutional data cannot be averaged to equal the provincial data.

Community colleges provided the data directly to the Council on Post-Secondary Education, as Statistics Canada no longer collects this data.

7.1 Manitoba Universities and Colleges

In 2000/01, the provincial government reduced tuition fee in Manitoba by 10% from 1999/00 levels. The 10% reduction applied to all full and part time students in for-credit programs leading to a graduate or undergraduate degree. Since the numbers in the table are weighted by Statistics Canada, the reduction appears to be less than 10% for the University of Manitoba and CUSB.

Concurrent with the 10% tuition fee reduction, the Council reimbursed institutions for the reduction in revenue and provided additional funding in recognition of the fact that the institutions were unable to raise additional revenue. This practice has continued annually.

7.1.2 Colleges

The provincial policy for the 10% fee reduction in 2000/01 was applied to students in for-credit Council funded programs leading to a certificate or diploma. College tuition has remained at the 2000/01 level.

7.2.1 University Tuition

Over the five year period, Manitoba continues to have the third lowest tuition fee in Canada.

1. Using the most current enrollment data available, average tuition fees have been weighted by the number of students. Statistics Canada believes a weighted tuition fee provides an accurate and reliable indicator of the majority of undergraduate students are paying when seeking historical comparison. A weighted average considers the proportion of students in each field of study. This allows a consistent view of fees at the undergraduate level over time.

2. BC tuition average includes both public and private institutions.

3. Fees for in and out of province students are included in this calculation. Quebec began charging non-Quebecois Canadians residents a differential fee in 1997/98.

7.2.2 College Tuition

In 2000/01, college tuition in Manitoba was reduced by 10% in accordance with provincial government initiative. Since then, Manitoba has had the second lowest average college tuition fees in Canada at \$1,292. Quebec has the lowest tuition in Canada.

7.3 Private Religious Institutions

As part of the funding arrangement with the Government of Manitoba, private religious institutions are expected to charge tuition for academic programs at a rate that is not less than tuition fee rates at public post-secondary institutions in Manitoba offering comparable courses.
