ABORIGINAL INTERNSHIP PROGRAM



In 2005, the MLCC developed an Aboriginal Employment Initiative (AEI) to achieve a workforce reflective of Manitoba's general population. As part of the AEI Strategic Plan, an Aboriginal Internship Program was developed in partnership with post-secondary education institutions and the Aboriginal community.

Program Description

The Aboriginal Internship Program offers Aboriginal people career-oriented work experience and insight into a government agency and the beverage alcohol industry. The program enables participants to develop their skills, gain exposure in the field, and assist in making a successful integration into the labour market. Interns will develop skills through formal courses, on the job training and mentorships.

Depending on the field of study, interns are placed in a term for a period of one or two years. Positions will be assigned throughout Liquor Marts, MLCC Head Office (Human Resources, Information Technology, Finance, Audit, Licensing and Inspections, Purchasing) and rural Inspection Services.
