OPERATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Sales increased \$17.1 million for the six-month period over the same period last year. This increase resulted from a 2.1% volume increase for spirits, a 7.6% volume increase for wine, supplier price increases and a continued consumer shift to premium products. Beer volumes which declined slightly due to weather conditions in the first quarter, recovered during good weather in July 2007. Net profit increased by \$5.6 million or 5.1%. The MLCC recognized a \$1 million reduction of the liability for future retirement allowances based on an actuarial report.

The MLCC continued to support the communities in which it operates with wine tasting events in Gimli in support of the Gimli Rotary Club and the Westshore Foundation; in The Pas in support of The Pas Health Complex Foundation; and Roblin in support of the Life & Art Centre. The Flatlander's Beer Festival raised over \$36,000 for the Manitoba Moose Yearling Foundation. The MLCC also sponsored larger events such as the Winnipeg Folk Festival, the Winnipeg Fringe Festival and the Dauphin Country Fest.

A new store opened in Lac du Bonnet in September, with a grand opening event planned for October. Construction of a 43,000 square foot expansion to our Distribution Center is slightly behind schedule due to the unavailability of some trades. The MLCC has entered into lease agreements for two new Liquor Marts on Henderson Highway and north Main Street. Both stores are expected to open in the next quarter.

The MLCC received acknowledgement of efforts to deliver excellence in customer service with a Consumer's Choice Award and a feature in the Connoisseur supplement to the Winnipeg Free Press. For the second year in a row, the MLCC was selected by MacLeans magazine as a Top 100 Employer in Canada and a Top 15 Employer in Manitoba. As part of the application process the MLCC conducted an employee engagement survey with results exceeding the Canadian average in all but one category. An employee Intranet was launched to improve communication with employees.

Retail and Inspection staff continue to work towards the implementation of the results from a job hazard analyses. The MLCC also began initiatives to create awareness of new whistleblower legislation.
