## Phase II Public Consultations for Chitek Lake Park Reserve

In 1998, a park reserve was established in the Chitek Lake area after discussions with Skownan First Nation and representatives of the forestry and mining sectors. The park reserve status for Chitek Lake was made for a five-year period that will expire in September 2004. A decision must be made on the status of the park reserve by this date.

In November 2003, Manitoba Conservation conducted the first phase of the public consultation process for the Chitek Lake Park Reserve. This consultation provided individuals and interested groups an opportunity to present their views concerning the Chitek Lake Park Reserve area.

A second set of Public Open House drop-in sessions has been arranged by Manitoba Conservation to provide Manitobans an opportunity to review feedback received up to this time and to provide comment on a proposal to establish Chitek Lake Provincial Park. Comments are welcomed regarding draft park purpose and classification statements and the boundary of the park. (See the brochure for more details).
