## RE: WHITEMOUTH FALLS PROVINCIAL PARK - PROPOSED BOUNDARY CHANGES

**From August 3-5, 2005,** Parks and Natural Areas Branch will be holding public drop-in sessions in Winnipeg, Seven Sisters Falls, and in Lac du Bonnet. The intent of these sessions is to provide an opportunity for public review and comment on the proposed boundary changes and changing role of the park, and a possible new Land Use Category and Classification for Whitemouth Falls Provincial Park, in accordance with Section 9 of *The Provincial Parks Act*.

**You are invited** to attend to review the information and provide comments on the proposed changes. The drop-in sessions will be held:

Winnipeg, Manitoba, at 200 Saulteaux Crescent from 12:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. in Boardroom A at the Manitoba Conservation office.

Seven Sisters Falls Hydro town site, Manitoba, at the Seven Sisters Community Centre located at 89 Elizabeth Crescent, from 12:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

## Friday, August 5, 2005

Lac du Bonnet, Manitoba, in the Manitoba Conservation office boardroom located at PR 502 & Park Avenue from 12:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Your review and comment on the proposed changes is welcomed. Comments are requested by August 26, 2005. Please do not hesitate to forward additional information along with your point of view respecting the future of the area.
