Park Role and Purpose:

The current provincial park role is: to provide outdoor recreational opportunities and experiences in a natural setting. Park purpose statements could include:

- Provide shoreline access for fishing and water-based recreational activities;
- Conserve and manage habitat for Manitoba's provincial bird, the Great Gray Owl.

Boundaries: ❖ Do you feel the current boundary amendment proposal for the provincial park properly reflect the area's management needs as you see them? Please explain. Maps are provided in the brochure for your reference.		

Classification and Land Use Categories: The existing Park Classification is Recreation Park - and the Land Use Category (LUC) is Recreational Development (RD) - on the sections of Whitemouth Provincial Park south of the Winnipeg River. The new section (north side of Winnipeg River) could involve establishment of either an RD or a Backcountry LUC to ensure habitat for the Great Gray Owl is maintained over time. The transmission line, Hydro severance and access, and any future development of a parking /interpretive node along the highway could not be included in a Backcountry LUC, and an Access or RD LUC would have to be considered for these areas. As well, the park classification could be changed to Natural Park to reflect the changes in its role arising from the proposed addition. What do you think? Other ideas you would like to see used to guide the management of this area:
