Created by the Law Library of the Library of Congress, the Global Legal Information Network (GLIN) provides access to an international database of complementary legal sources through a web browser interface. Contributors provide official full texts in their original language, plus a summary in English. In 2005, the Library of Parliament agreed to provide Canada's contribution and library staff are working through the Canadian federal statutes to be added to the database.
