Get the shot, not the flu!

And protect with a pneumococcal shot too.

Flu

You should get a free flu shot every year if you are:

- o age 65 or older
- o a child age six to 23 months
- an adult or child with heart or lung disease, or other chronic illness
- o a health care worker
- a first responder (police officer, fire fighter, paramedic)
- a household contact of someone under age two, or 65 years of age and older
- opregnant (regardless of trimester or due date)

Flu facts:

- The flu is extremely contagious. It can cause serious illness and death.
- You cannot get the flu from the flu shot there is no live virus in the vaccine.

Pneumococcal

You should get a free pneumococcal shot if you are:

- o age 65 or older
- o an adult or child with heart or lung disease, or other chronic disease

Pneumococcal facts:

- Pneumococcal bacteria can cause serious illness, including
 - pneumonia,
 - blood poisoning (bacteremia) and
 - meningitis.
- Most people need only one pneumococcal shot in their lifetime.
