NOTE:



- No walking / hiking is permitted on groomed cross-country ski trails.
- All pets must be in direct physical control at all times eg. leashed, harnessed.
- Dogs are not permitted on cross-country ski trails.
- Please help us keep the park clean by picking up after your dog.
- All trails are signed for one way traffic.
- Remember, during the winter months, daylight fades quickly after 4:00 P.M.
- All trail distances are approximate.
- For further information call 654-6730 Birds Hill.
- Cross-country skiers are permitted only on cross-country ski trails.
- Ski-joring and kick sledding are not permitted on cross-country ski or snowmobile / dog sled trails.
- Horses are not permitted on cross-country ski trails during winter months.

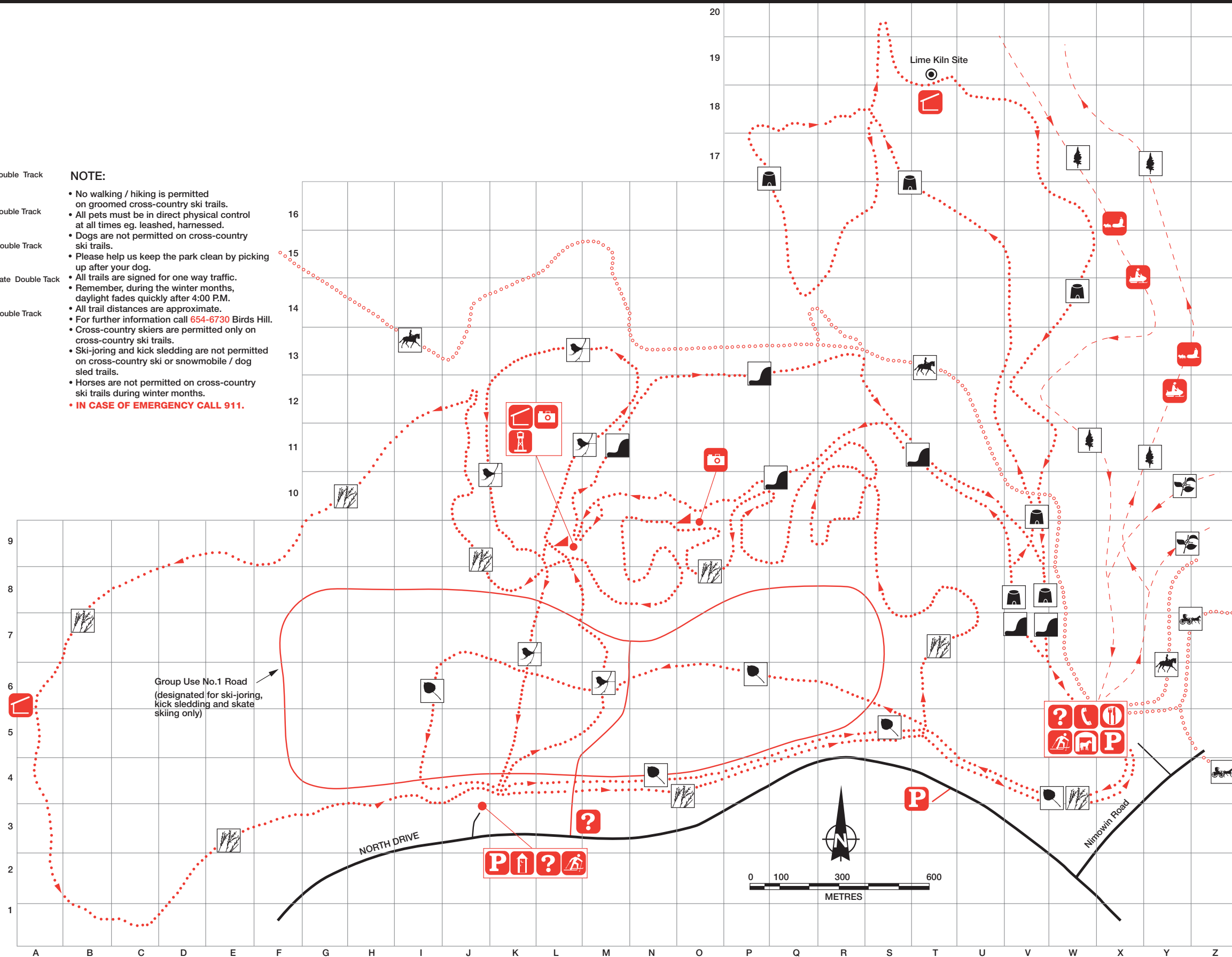

HORSEBACK RIDERS

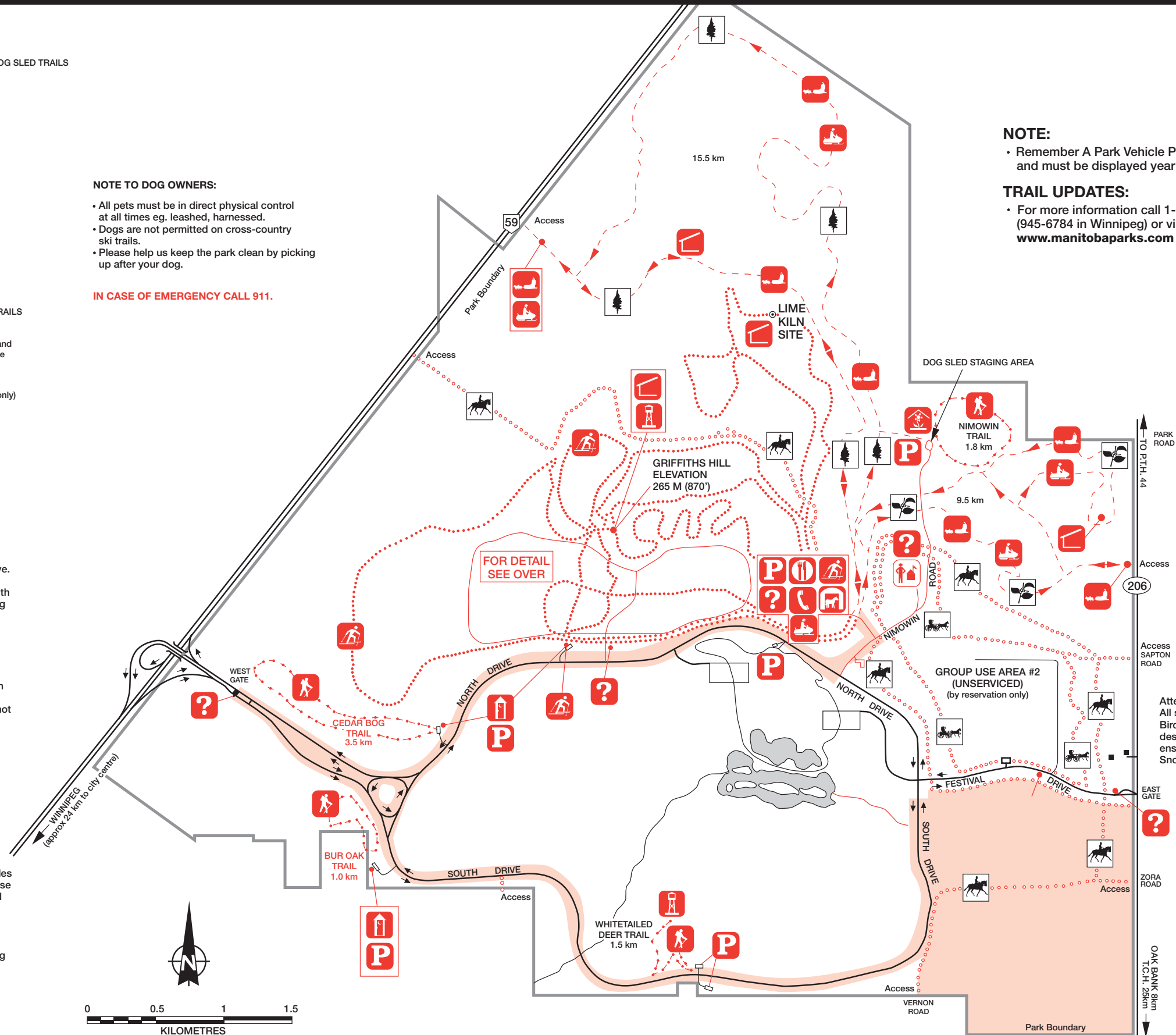
- Riders may use:
 - Marked horse trails (Far Pines, Carriage Way) as well as unmarked trails in the shaded area south of Festival Drive.
 - The area beside the road shoulders on West, North, South and Festival Drives and Nimowin Road north of the riding stable area. Please attempt to ride beside, rather than directly on road shoulders.
- Riders are not permitted elsewhere in the park:
 - Many trails used by riders during the summer are designated for cross-country skiing and snowmobiling in the winter. Please stay off these trails.
 - Ride with extreme caution near park roads. Riders are not permitted on park road surfaces.

HORSE-DRAWN VEHICLE DRIVERS

- Horse-drawn vehicles with wheels may use the West, North, South and Festival Drives and Nimowin Road to the riding stable area. Sleighs must use the area beside the shoulder of these roads.
- The Carriage Way trail is designated for all horse drawn vehicles.
- Horse-drawn vehicles are subject to traffic regulations and require a reflective slow moving vehicle sign. Vehicles used after dark require a legal lighting system. Please use extreme caution when approaching her horses, cars and pedestrians.

DOG SLED USERS:

- Dog sleds are permitted on snowmobile trails only during daylight hours.
- Dog sleds are not permitted at Riding Stable area.
- Designated dog sled staging area at Nimowin Trail / Interpretive centre parking lot.



Attention Snowmobilers:
All snowmobile trails in Birds Hill Provincial Park are designated SnoFund Trails. Please ensure each snowmobile has a valid SnoPass.
