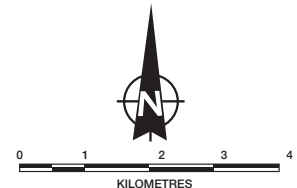
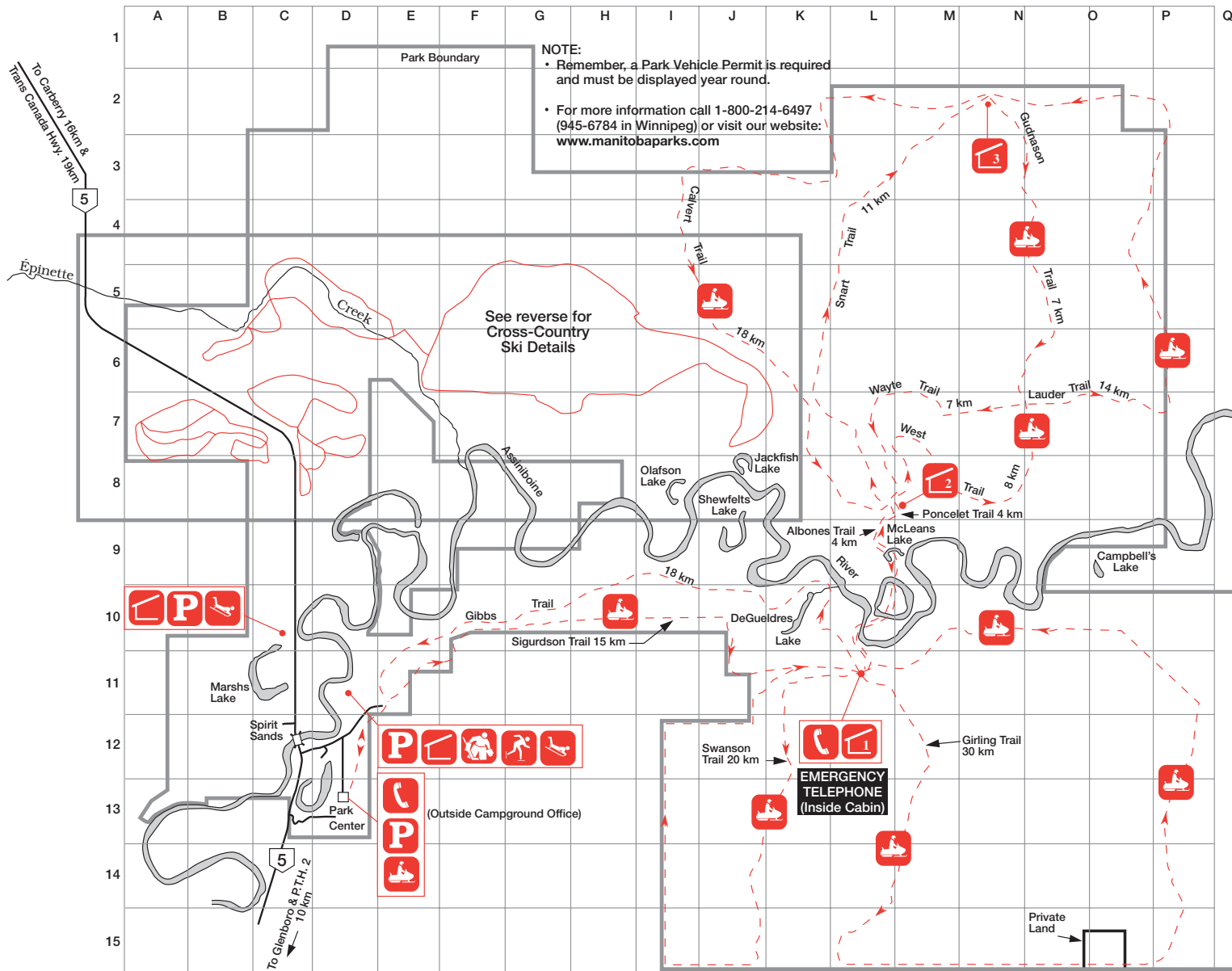


Spruce Woods Winter Activities

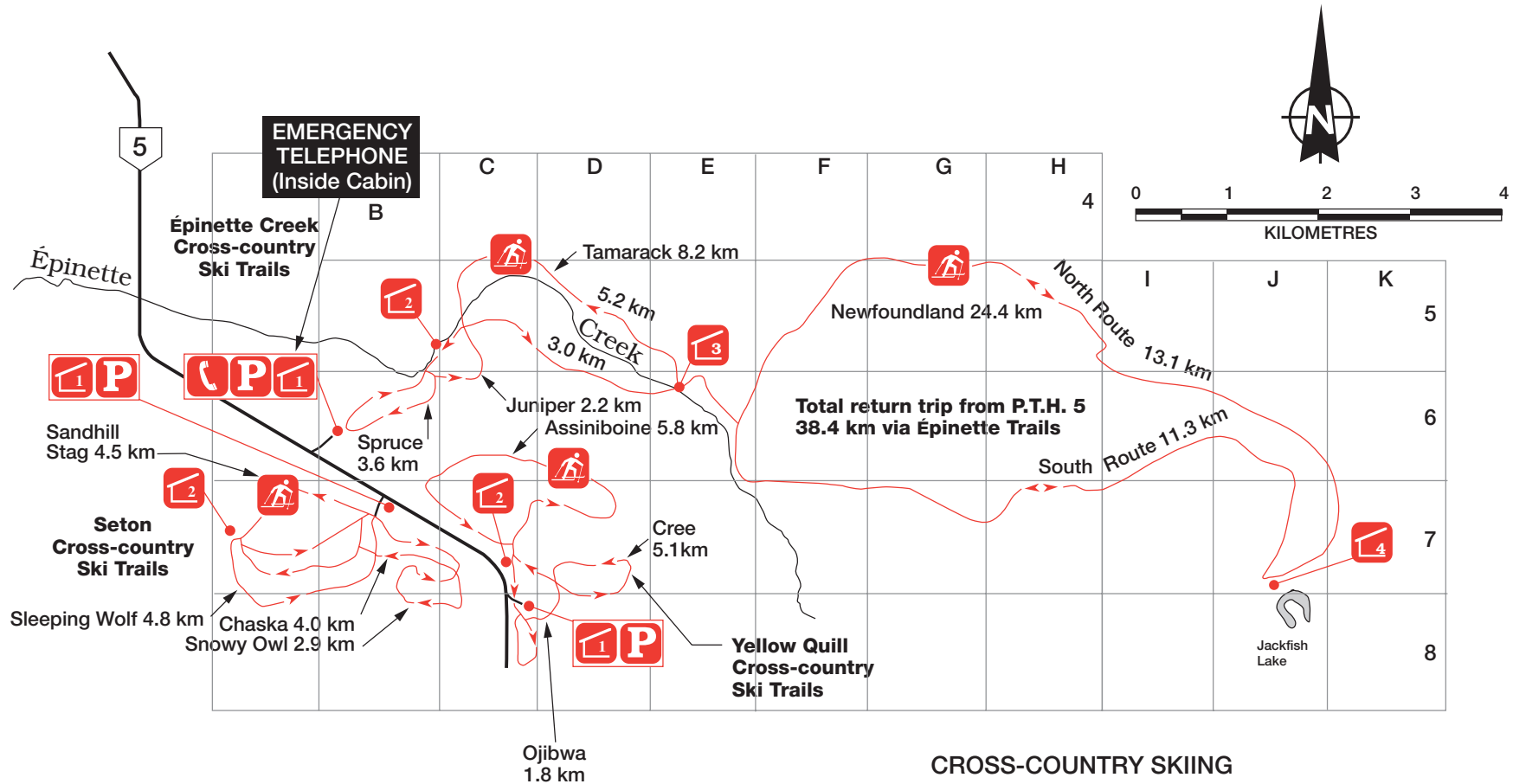
Snowmobilers should exercise caution at the river crossing during late fall and late winter when ice conditions may be unsafe. Please observe signs on the condition of the river crossing.
