The Manitoba Attorney General 2007 Safer Communities Awards

for Community Activism

The Reverend Harry Lehotsky Award



Purpose

The award is named in honour of the significant and dedicated community activism, advocacy and ongoing leadership of Reverend Lehotsky. Through his tireless commitment to enhance the quality of his neighbourhood in Winnipeg's West End, he serves as an important role model, enlightening and encouraging others to work for community improvement and enhanced public safety.

The award recognizes an individual's efforts to strengthen the community in Manitoba, and through these efforts, directly or indirectly help achieve a safer community.

Selection

The award recipient will be chosen from individuals nominated by Manitoba residents, as part of the annual call for nominations for the Attorney General's Safer Communities Awards. The selection will be made by the committee established by the Attorney General. This committee is made up of individuals who represent a diversity of approaches to community safety, as well as a representative from the Lehotsky family and/or New Life Ministries.

Criteria

A nominee's activities must lead to positive outcomes for public safety at either the neighbourhood, or larger community, level and must demonstrate the following:

- activism that transcends verbal and political advocacy and results in practical and tangible community improvements
- sustained activism that is proven and consistent over time

A nominee must:

- live in the area where the activism is taking place
- ensure activities are not solely sustained by government funding
- NOT be a member of the Manitoba Legislature, or a member of the Safer Communities Awards organizing or selection committees

A nominee may:

- pursue activism through either volunteerism or a paid position
- come from any community or neighbourhood in Manitoba

The Award

The Manitoba Government will contribute \$2,000, from its Crime Prevention Fund, to a registered charity of the recipient's choice. The charity must have an objective that directly or indirectly enhances community safety in Manitoba.

Presentation of Award

The award recipient will be contacted by a Manitoba Justice representative a few weeks before the annual Manitoba Attorney General's Safer Community Awards Ceremony. The award will be presented by the Manitoba Attorney General and a representative of the Lehotsky family and/or New Life Ministries.
