Special Occasion Permit Information for Charitable Organizations

LIN: 0510 November 2000

Charitable, not-for-profit organizations **may qualify** to obtain a Special Occasion Permit, if the proceeds are being donated:

- to provide financial assistance for expenses incurred by a family, due to acute, life threatening illnesses of a family member (i.e travel, loss of wages, hotel accommodations, lack of medical insurance)
- community organization needs (i.e. restoration of a building)
- for a bona fide charitable organization
- for the purchase of equipment beneficial to a community (i.e. medical, safety)

Please be aware that the following conditions are attached to your permit and must be adhered to:

- The permit holder is responsible for assuring that all laws, regulations and rules made under the Liquor Control Act are respected and obeyed.
- A Summary of Donated Funds form must be completed within 30 days following the function to ensure that the proceeds were donated to the cause indicated on the application.
- The permit must be located at the bar area.
- Persons under 19 years are not permitted on the premises.
- On the date specified, only liquor authorized under the special occasion permit can be on-site.
- All liquor at this function must be purchased by the permit holder or authorized purchaser through an NB Liquor Outlet only. (No homemade alcoholic products or "BYOB" is permited on site).
- All remaining liquor must be taken from the premises after the event.
- Liquor Sales must end at 2:00 a.m. or before and guests must vacate the premises no later than 2:30 a.m.
- Advertising is permitted for charitable functions.
- There is no maximum or minimum sale price of liquor.
- ▶ The price for alcohol beverages can be determined by the permit holder.
