No fuel, No fire!

Good housekeeping in the workplace can eliminate the materials – the fuel – to start a fire and keep it burning.

- Keep storage and work areas clear of trash.
- Clean up spills - put oily rags in a covered container.
- Keep all waste containers securely covered.
- Keep access to emergency equipment clear.

Good housekeeping reduces the risk of fire destroying your workplace... and your job!

Hot Work

Know and follow your company's hot work program!

- Have the right fire equipment ready, and know how to use it.
- Remove flammable materials from within 10 meters of the work area.
- Protect combustible materials that cannot be moved.
- Check regularly for explosive or flammable dust and vapors.
- Prevent heat transfer through walls and floors to combustibles.
- Use only properly-maintained equipment.

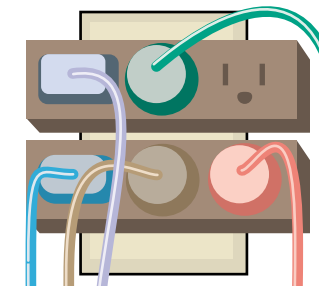


Hot work is safer when you follow the program.

Electricity

Industry depends on electricity to operate. Under proper conditions, electricity need not be feared. Keep yourself and your workplace safe from electrical fire by understanding and respecting electricity.

- Keep electric motors properly cleaned and maintained.
- Always use the proper size breakers and fuses.
- Don't overload electrical outlets.
- Discard damaged electrical cords.
- Follow proper standards and codes when using or installing electrical equipment.



Even a small electrical fire can cause a major interruption in operations...and your job.

Flammable liquids and gases

Flammable liquids and gases can cause an explosion.

- Store and transport flammable liquids in approved containers.
- Use flammable liquids only in well-ventilated areas.
- Do not refuel equipment while it is still hot.
- Clean up spills right away.

It is the vapour of flammable liquids that burns.
