South Indian Lake

Community Status

South Indian Lake is situated on an arm of the lake that joins South Bay to the main body of the Lake. Approximately two-thirds of the residents are members of the Nelson House Band, many of whom can trace ancestry back to the 1920s.

The community is about 130 air km Northwest of Thompson and 64 air km from Leaf Rapids. PR # 391, which connects both Thompson and Leaf Rapids, also extends to South Bay, providing access to the ferry/barge in season.

The community has undergone major change as a result of the Churchill River Diversion, which causes water to flow south to the Rat River, then through the Burntwood river into the Nelson River to provide additional water for Hydro development on the lower Nelson River.

Recognized as a community in 1971 by the department, and incorporated in 1999, the community is governed by an Incorporated Council consisting of mayor and councillors under *The Northern Affairs Act*.

Fire

Fire fighting capability is based on a pumper truck and equipment from the community fire hall. Portable forestry equipment is also available for grass and brush fires.

Police

Police response is from the Leaf Rapids detachment RCMP, phone (204) 473-2469. There is also two community constables who respond in the community.

Medical

Medical response is based on a federal nursing station staffed by three nurses and two community health workers, with a five bed capacity. The community also qualifies for Patient Transport assistance.

Water is drawn from the Churchill River system via wet-well intake to the pumphouse. It is then put through a package treatment plant and chlorinated. The major buildings in the community core area are connected to a distribution system. Residences are served by truck delivery.

Waste Disposal

Solid-waste is picked up twice weekly by a local contractor and taken to the solid-waste disposal site located near the community.

Most residences have sewage pumpout, which is then hauled for treatment in an sequencing batch reactor (SBR) sewage treatment plant.

Economic Overview

The most important economic activity is commercial fishing. Fishers deliver their catch to the Leaf Rapids fish station. Trapping contributes some additional income. The community is located in the South Indian Lake Registered Trap Line Zone.
