2. The Consumer Advocate represents the interests of domestic and general service consumers of electricity in the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador and accordingly has an interest in the operation of the Rate Stabilization Plan and in the methodology for determining specifically assigned costs.

Disposition Advocated by the Consumer Advocate



Application. However, the Consumer Advocate may wish to file requests for information as provided by the *Board of Commissioners of Public Utilities Regulations, 1996*, and to avail of the right to cross-examine witnesses or to submit argument at a public hearing of the Application, all as the circumstances may require.
