The Newfoundland and Labrador Volunteer Medal selection committee will independently review nominations.

The committee will look at a number of factors including length and level of service, as well as benefits to the community at large.

Criteria for receiving the medal are high, as there are many deserving volunteers in the province.

Two volunteers from each of the 48 electoral districts in the province will be selected, one male and one female.

The Volunteer Medal Selection Committee is comprised of seven members, including a Chairperson and members appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.

Volunteer medals will be presented to recipients at a special ceremony to honour their contributions.
