# Instructions to Applicants

# THIS APPLICATION SHOULD BE ACCOMPANIED BY:

- Application fee of \$40.00. (an additional \$40.00 fee if you are an international student or a student transferring from a college and/or university outside of Newfoundland and Labrador.)
  - Other documents as specified by the program for which you are applying.

#### Also required:

- An official transcript of your high school grades to date.
   An official copy of your university transcript(s) to date.

Please Note: All transcripts must be OFFICIAL and must be sent by the University or College that you attended, or the Department of Education, directly to the Marine Institute Registrar's Office. Grade Reports will not be accepted. If you attended Memorial University this information will be obtained internally.

### **APPLICATION DEADLINES ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

Applications received after these deadlines will be considered on an individual basis. If an application cannot be processed due to time constraints, it will be considered for the next available session.

Canadian students April 15 for September; September 30 for January International students April 1 for September; August 1 for January

#### PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

Applicants to selected Marine Institute programs are required to provide proof of physical fitness prior to enrolment for participation in training for emergency situations and for Transport Canada certification.

Students in programs leading to seagoing careers will need to submit two medicals - the Marine Institute (MI) Medical and the Transport Canada Seafarers' Medical. Students in programs that involve emergency training but do not lead to Transport Canada certification only require the MI Medical.

Programs that require proof of physical fitness include:

#### **Both Medicals**

Diploma of Technology Nautical Science Diploma of Technology Marine Engineering Vocational Certificate in Marine Diesel Mechanics Technical Certificate in Pre-Sea Deckhand

#### MI Medical Only

Vocational Certificate in Offshore Structural Steel Plate Fitter Technical Certificate in Firefighting Diploma of Technology Marine Environmental (Year 2)

In all cases, student medicals must be completed by physicians authorized by the Marine Institute or Transport Canada. Lists of approved physicians are available from the Marine Institute's Registrar's Office. Students must present proof of physical fitness to the Registrar's Office with the appropriate medical form signed by the authorized physician. Please note that medicals do expire and may need to be repeated prior to completion of a program.

# ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

#### **Diplomas of Technology and Technician Diplomas - Newfoundland Applicants**

Newfoundland applicants require a senior high school Level III Graduation Certificate or equivalent and shall have obtained credits in the following subjects, with a minimum overall average of 60% in the 3000 level courses.

Mathematics: 2 credits from Level III Academic\* or Advanced (\*a minimum of 60% must be achieved in this subject)

Language: One Level III language

Science: 4 credits, two of which must be from a Level III Physics, Biology, Chemistry, or Earth Systems

### Diplomas of Technology and Technician Diplomas - Applicants from Outside Newfoundland

Canadian citizens who reside outside Newfoundland and Labrador require a Grade XII graduation in a University Preparatory Program (the Secondary V Certificate for Quebec applicants) with a passing mark in the required courses equivalent to those identified for Newfoundland applicants and an overall average of no less than 60% in these courses.

#### **Vocational Certificate Programs**

Applicants require high school completion or a recognized equivalent.

#### **Technical Certificate Programs**

Applicants require completion of the grade required for the particular program for which they are applying.

#### **Mature Students**

Mature students are 21 years of age or older within one month of the start of the program. The admission requirements above describe the minimum qualifications individuals should have in order to succeed in each respective program area. Individuals may obtain the equivalent or other suitable qualifications from alternate sources to prepare them for technology programs.

Applicants must demonstrate they have a technical or practical expertise, or a combination of both, in the intended field of study. Mature applicants should submit an Application for Admission, as well as the following documentation:

- A resume outlining all associated experience
- A letter of recommendation from an employer or other individual who can attest to an applicant's qualifications
- Official academic transcripts of high school and post-secondary studies
- Proof of age

### **Transfers from Other Canadian Universities/Colleges**

Students from other universities/colleges will be considered for admission upon producing satisfactory documentation. Students forced to withdraw from another university/college will not be eligible for admission to the Marine Institute until the associated withdrawal penalty has been served. Students transferring from other colleges/universities, and students with prior academic or work experience may apply for Credit Transfer or a Challenge Examination. Please refer to the Marine Institute Calendar for the policies, regulations and procedures governing transfers of credit and challenge examinations.

### **Applicants from Other Countries**

As the Marine Institute does not offer financial assistance to foreign students, a statement of satisfactory financial resources must be submitted with your Application for Admission. Please refer to the Marine Institute Calendar for regulations governing English Proficiency Requirements. Applicants to programs that normally lead to Transport Canada certification should note that certification is only available to Canadian Citizens or landed immigrants. Information on entering Canada to study as a foreign student should be obtained from the applicant's nearest Canadian Embassy or Consular Office.
