Section 2: Specific Information

The following information must be provided and attached to the application form. Applications not including this information will not be processed.

1. A letter demonstrating familiarity with the purpose of the reserve and the applicable regulations and policies, and detailing any experience in the reserve.
2. A resume outlining your seabird colony experience.
3. A letter of reference from a seabird biologist.
4. A letter of confirmation from a seabird ecological reserve guide stating that you have visited the reserve with them and were given an orientation.

*** NOTE ***

1. In accordance with the *Wilderness and Ecological Reserves Act*, and pursuant regulations and policies, seabird ecological reserve guides must have a permit from Parks and Natural Areas Division.
2. A separate application must be submitted for each reserve.
3. Seabird ecological reserve guides are responsible for the visitors they are guiding and must ensure visitor compliance with the applicable regulations and policies. Guides will be responsible for completing a reserve visitation report and submitting it to Parks and Natural Areas Division each time they guide.
4. Please allow a minimum of two weeks for your application to be processed.
5. If a permit is granted, all parties land on the island at their own risk.
6. Guide status is valid for five years after which time you must reapply.
